Retiring Associate Trustees Honored

CHANUKAH CANDLES FROM BENEVOLENT FUND

Once again, the membership has been mailed boxes of Chanukah candles with the compliments of the Benevolent Fund. In addition, a special Chanukah booklet was included in our package this year.

Members—indeed all our readers—know full well of the work which is accomplished through the Benevolent Fund. It is from this fund that hundreds of worthy charities and deserving individuals are helped to maintain themselves. The office has on file many letters of thanks which were received from countless individuals to whose assistance the Fund came. It has, too, many additional letters requesting further support and seeking much needed aid.

We cannot turn these requests down. We know that our members would not want us to turn a deaf ear to these pleas for help. It is therefore fitting that, in keeping with the spirit of Chanukah celebration, you practice an act of kindness and respond generously to the Benevolent Fund. All contributions should be made directly to the Benevolent Fund and sent to the Synagogue Office.

At the meeting of the Board of Trustees held last Monday night, tribute was paid to the Associate Trustees of the Congregation who completed their tour of duty. What took place at that meeting was so beautifully and impressively done, that it might well constitute a precedent for the future.

Many years ago, it was considered advisable to appoint Associate Trustees, in order to familiarize a larger number of congregants with the affairs and administration of Kehilath Jeshurun. This purpose has, indeed, been well served.

When Associate Trustees retire from office, they become part of a pool from which, eventually, are drawn the Trustees of the Congregation. It was, therefore, fitting to pay tribute to those who, for several years, have performed valiantly and generously their duties to the Congregation, and now become part of the pool of future potential Trustees.
