# CHIEF RABBI OF ISRAELI ARMY OUR GUEST THIS SATURDAY Hero of Sinai Campaign Will Occupy Pulpit

Rabbi Solomon Goren, Chief Rabbi of the Israeli Army, will be the guest of our Congregation this Sabbath. The renowned hero of the Sinai campaign, who has spent several weeks in this country and is about to return to Israel, will spend his final Sabbath in America, at Kehilath Jeshurun.

It is fitting that on this Sabbath Chanukah, associated historically with the glorious deeds of the Maccabees, we should have in our midst one who, as part of the Israeli Army, is symbolic of the modern Maccabees.

Rabbi Goren is one of the great Talmudic scholars of our day, trained under the tutelage of the late Chief Rabbi Kook. Rabbi Goren early acquired a reputation as a Talmudic genius. He is the author of an important rabbinic work and is now engaged in publishing a further monumental work on the Jerusalem Talmud. To be at once a great scholar as well as an accomplished parachutist, is part of the record of this most unusual person.

It is needless to urge all of our congregants to be in the Synagogue this Saturday. All that is necessary is to remind the Kehilath Jeshurun family that this will be a rare opportunity to be in the presence of one who deserves every honor, tribute and recognition.
