Dr. Robert Wallach, President of the Men's Club, has announced that the Men's Club Annual Dinner will take place on Tuesday evening, January 15th, in the Social Hall of the Synagogue House. The guest speaker at the dinner will be a distinguished member of the Synagogue and Men's Club, Dr. Victor Wouk. Irving Davidison, well known humorist and raconteur will entertain.

Dr. Wouk, an electrical engineer, has achieved considerable stature in his profession. He is a member of the Institute of Radio Engineers and of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. For his contribution in developing the atomic bomb during World War II, Dr. Wouk received a citation from the Manhattan Engineering District signed by the Secretary of War. He is president of the Beta Electric Corporation.

In addition to his professional activities, Dr. Wouk is a member of the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan New York Commission on Talmud Torah Education.

At a time when the entire world is reexamining the role of science in our society, it is fitting that we hear from a man who combines leadership in science and in Jewish education.

ADULT INSTITUTE

The Adult Institute Lecture Series has reached its midway point. Dr. Norman Frimer, Metropolitan Regional Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation has delivered three of a series of seven lectures on the general topic, "What Jews Believe–Our Classical Heritage." Thus far the following topics have been discussed: "Judaism and the God Concept," "Judaism and the Concept of Israel," and "Judaism and the Revelation of Torah."

Dr. Frimer has evolved, in his years of experience in adult education, a technique which both conveys information and stimulates thought. Each student receives a pamphlet containing readings from Biblical and rabbinic literature bearing on the lecture topic. During the course of the lecture, these selections are read aloud and analyzed. The student retains these readings for ready reference.

The lecture series will resume on January 8th, when Dr. Frimer will speak on "Judaism and the Land of Israel." The Talmud and Hebrew classes will continue to meet as usual on Wednesday evenings at eight o'clock.

CONGREGATION CELEBRATES MEMORABLE CHANUKAH

Chanukah was celebrated at Kehilath Jeshurun in the usual fitting and dignified manner in the Synagogue and at programs arranged by all the synagogue affiliates. Highlighting the entire week was the presence in the synagogue this past Sabbath of Rabbi Solomon Goren, chief rabbi of the Israel Defense Forces.
