ISRAEL BONDS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE SYNAGOGUE

We are happy to announce that unsolicited pledges for Bonds totaling nearly \$25,000 have been received in the Synagogue Office, in response to the address of Rabbi Solomon Goren, Chief Rabbi of the Israel Defense Forces. Although no formal appeal took place in the Synagogue, immediately following Rabbi Goren's talk many congregants expressed a desire to purchase Israel Bonds. Anticipating a demand for the purchase of Israel Bonds through the Synagogue, a supply of Bond applications has been obtained. It would be fitting that we might inform Rabbi Goren of substantial purchases of Israel Government Bonds as a result of his visit to Kehilath Jeshurun on the last Sabbath of his tour through the United States and Canada.

Dr. Wouk, a prominent electrical engineer, is the recipient of a citation awarded him by the United States Army Corps of Engineers for his contribution to the development of the atom bomb in the Manhattan Project. He is active in Jewish communal affairs and is an officer of the Metropolitan New York Commission on Talmud Torah Education, sponsored by Yeshiva University and the Jewish Education Committee. Dr. Wouks' theme will deal with the role that science has played in shaping present-day society.

SISTERHOOD TO HEAR REPORT ON JUVENILE DELINQUENCY

At the next Sisterhood meeting on Monday afternoon, January 13, a program which was scheduled for earlier in the season, but was postponed to this date will be presented.

A symposium will be presented on the subject "Juvenile Delinquency in Our Neighborhood." Participating in the panel are two men who are actively involved in programs to control the spread of juvenile delinquency in this area of the city: Patrolman Naeder and Bernard Clyne. Patrolman Naeder is Director of Youth Activities of the 19th Precinct which covers the area from 65th Street to 86th Street and from Fifth Avenue to the East River. He administers the Police Athletic League program and is responsible for establishing relationships with known and potential juvenile gangs and delinquents. As part of his duties, he maintains contact with the youth serving agencies in the area.

Bernard Clyne is a project worker for Interfaith Neighbors. He works with delinquents and potential delinquent gangs in our neighborhood.

In addition, a fascinating film on the case history of a delinquent called "Boy with a Knife" will be shown. The moderator will be Theodore Comet, Director of the Youth Department of American Zionist Council.

As you can see, the program will be a full and stimulating one, and we look forward to your joining us on January 13th. Luncheon will be served at 12:30 o'clock.
