# Federation Appeal Receives Generous Response

# DR. LEON D. STITSKIN TO OCCUPY PULPIT ON FEBRUARY 1ST

Dr. Leon D. Stitskin, Director of Community Relations of Yeshiva University's Community Service Division, will occupy the pulpit on February 1st. Dr. Stitskin received his rabbinic ordination at Yeshiva University's Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary in 1932 and was awarded a Doctor of Philosophy Degree from Yeshiva's School of Education and Community Administration. Prior to joining the Yeshiva University staff in 1953, Dr. Stitskin served as Rabbi of the Jewish Community Center, Philadelphia, and of the Beth Joseph Center, Rochester, New York.

An outstanding preacher, he is author of a collection of sermons "Judaism as a Religion" and has served as author of the Sermon Manual of the Rabbinical Council of America.

In 1950 Dr. Stitskin went to Israel on behalf of the American Zionist Council and the Congressional Committee of Upstate New York. Upon his return his "Report on Israel" was read into the "Congressional Record" of the 81st Congress on Israel's Independence Day, and the Council also published his report on "Religion in Israel." Last Sabbath marked the first time that Kehilath Jeshurun specially designated a Sabbath for an appeal for the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies. In spite of the inclement weather, a large number of worshipers attended services.

The appeal was conducted with the impressive dignity which characterizes all services at Kehilath Jeshurun. Pledge cards were distributed to congregants as they entered the synagogue. Before delivering the sermon, Rabbi Lookstein spoke briefly on the activities of Federation agencies. He stressed the importance of contributing to central charitable organizations rather than diminishing the effect of the philanthropic dollar by distributing funds among many small charities. The congregation responded to the appeal with its usual generosity.

Because of the weather many members who regularly attend services were unable to attend. As a convenience to those members, we are enclosing Federation pledge cards with this Bulletin. Only new pledges, previously unrecorded by the Federation, should be indicated on these cards.

Let us respond generously and register our support for this central fund-raising agency for local Jewish charities in the greater New York area. The pledge cards should be returned to the synagogue office.
