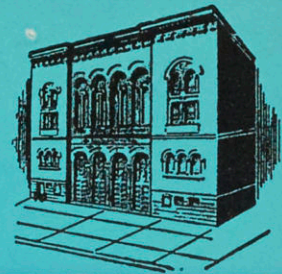

#### **NEW YEAR BOOK ADS RECEIVED**

We are again happy to note the activity of our members for the 1958 Year Book. In addition to those members who have already been mentioned, our devoted members Mr. William Fischberg, Mr. Samuel Frank and Mr. Samuel Goldberg have been especially active in soliciting ads.

The proceeds from the Year Book benefit the Educational Scholarship Fund which enables worthy students to attend the Ramaz School and the afternoon Religious School. Allocations are also made for college, professional school and summer camp scholarships.

## **RAMAZ DINNER-DANCE BENEFITS SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

The Annual Dinner-Dance of the Ramaz school took place in the Grand Ballroom of the Waldorf Astoria Hotel on Sunday evening, January 19th. Over seven hundred friends of Ramaz attended this gala affair, the proceeds of which benefited the Ramaz Scholarship Fund.

Mr. Henry Rem and Mr. Alexander Gross were co-chairman of this year's affair. Thanks to the magnificent efforts of these men and to the devoted service of Mr. Muni Hammer, chairman of the Journal committee, it now appears that a record amount of money will have been collected for this fund.

Of the approximately 500 students attending the Ramaz School, 54% receive some form of scholarship aid. Without this assistance the school would be unable to pursue its policy of admitting all qualified students regardless of financial status. The many contributors to the Journal may well share a feeling of pride when they examine the record which graduates of Ramaz have achieved. Last year 21 of the 22 Ramaz High School Seniors took the New York State Scholarship Examination. 14 of this group — a percentage of 67% — won State Scholarships. Ramaz students have won high honors in the Westinghouse Talent Search, the National Honors Society and in the National Merit Scholarship competition.

But the Ramaz Dinner-Dance is more than a Fund Raising venture. It is a gathering of men and women who are devoted to the type of education which Ramaz School offers and who are convinced of the importance of this type of education for the future of the American Jewish community. For that

reason, in spite of the numbers in attendance, the Ramaz Dinner-Dance is reminiscent of a large family gathering. This feeling of friendliness was due in no small measure to the efforts of Mrs. Milton Lukashok, president of the Ramaz Parents Council, Mrs. Harry W. Baumgarten and Mr. Max Sadimoff, co-chairmen of the Arrangements Committee. These people and the hard working executive and office staff of Ramaz deserve the credit for the success of the affair.

Long after-dinner speeches, by tradition, are eliminated from the program of Ramaz Dinner-Dances. Mrs. Lukashok and Mr. Rem both delivered short talks of welcome and appreciation to the guests. No Ramaz affair would be complete without a message from the Principal of the school, Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein. Rabbi Lookstein conveyed his personal thanks to all the many hard workers and supporters of Ramaz and outlined in a few chosen words the objectives of a Ramaz education. The guests left the ballroom feeling that they had participated in one of the most worthwhile activities in American Jewish education.

#### **RABBI AND MRS LOOKSTEIN ARRIVE IN ISRAEL**

## SISTERHOOD TO HEAR TALK ON "CONGRESS AND THE SUPREME COURT"

Miss Shirley Levittan, Constitutional Lawyer and Consultant to the Majority Leader of the New York State Senate, will be the guest speaker at the next open Luncheon meeting of the Sisterhood on Monday, February 10th.

Miss Levittan will speak on "Congress and the Supreme Court." Recently Miss Levittan attracted considerable attention in legal circles with an article which she co-authored with Judge Samuel Hofstadter in the New York Law Journal entitled "Congressional Investigations and the Code of Fair Practice." Miss Levittan will make reference to the investigatory powers of Congress in her talk.

Now in private law practice, Miss Levittan is a member of the Law Committee of the Republican Party and has been attached to the Office of the State Attorney General where she specializes in legal problems affecting New York City.

Mrs. Harry W. Baumgarten is program chairman for this meeting.

### INSTITUTE LECTURE SERIES ENDS WEDNESDAY EVENING

Dr. Norman Frimer will deliver the last lecture in the series of "What Jews Believe — Our Classical Heritage" this Wednesday evening, at 9 o'clock. His subject will be "Judaism and the Non-Jew, Living in Two Civilizations".

During the course of the lectures, Dr. Frimer has examined central concepts in Jewish thought. The outline of lecture topics gives but a slight indication of the variety and depth of the lectures. Beginning with an introductory lecture on "Judaism and the God Concept" Dr. Frimer has analyzed the normative Jewish attitudes toward the concept of Israel, the revelation of Torah, the land of Israel, the family and the Sabbath.

For most of the lectures a brochure of selected readings from Jewish literature was distributed. Regular attendants was acquired a permanent record to supplement their lecture notes. This material was read aloud and discussed during the presentation of the lecture.

### RAMAZ SENIOR WINS WESTINGHOUSE SCHOLARSHIP

Miss Sybil Herschkopf, senior in the Ramaz High School, has been awarded one of forty scholarships in the Annual Science Talent Search sponsored by the Westinghouse Corporation. 4,050 selected High School seniors were permitted to take a qualifying examination. 1,074 passed this hurdle. Included in this group were all three Ramaz seniors who took the examination. In addition to Miss Herschkopf they include Philip Rabinowitz and George Wilner.

The Westinghouse Science Scholarship is one of the most coveted of all such awards. Congratulations are in order to the students, their teachers and parents on this fine achievement.

**DR. BERNARD LANDER TO DELIVER SERMON ON FEBRUARY 8TH**

On February 8th Dr. Bernard Lander, director of the Bernard Revel Graduate School of Yeshiva University, will deliver the sermon. Dr. Lander was ordained at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University, and received a Doctorate in Sociology from Columbia University.

He has authored a definitive study on the dynamics of Juvenile Delinquency. In addition to his scholarly pursuits, Dr. Lander has chaired and participated in committees of the Rabbinical Council of America, the Mizrahi organization of America, the Synagogue Council of America, and the Mayor's Committee on Unity. He is known as a dynamic speaker whose message always offers much food for thought.

Dr. Lander is the second guest to occupy the pulpit during Rabbi Lookstein's visit to Israel.
