#### DR. BERNARD LANDER TO DELIVER SERMON THIS SABBATH

Dr. Bernard Lander. Director of the Bernard Revel Graduate School of Yeshiva University will occupy the pulpit this Sabbath, Dr. Lander received his rabbinic ordination at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University. He persued post graduate work in sociology at Columbia University where he received his doctorate.

Dr. Lander is the second guest to occupy the pulpit during Rabbi Lookstein's visit to Israel.

He has authored a definitive study on the dynamics of juvenile delinquency. In addition to his scholarly pursuits, Dr. Lander has chaired and participated in committees of the Rabbinical Council of America, the Mizrachi Organization of America, the Synagogue Council of America, and the Mayor's Committee on Unity. ### RELIGIOUS SCHOOL PARTICIPATES IN PEDAGOGIC CONFERENCE

The Religious School will be represented this Sunday at a Pedagogic Conference sponsored by the Jewish Education Committee. The Religious School is affiliated with the Metropolitan New York Commission on Talmud Torah Education under the auspices of the Jewish Education Committee and Yeshiva University. The theme of this year's Pedagogic Conference is the introduction of material relating to Israel in the school curriculum.

At the conference, an Educators' Council, whose membership will include principals of traditional religious schools, will be organized. The conference will meet at the Stern College for Women of Yeshiva University.


