Youth To Conduct Purim Services Wednesday Evening, March 5th

The festive holiday of Purim will be ushered in this year on Wednesday evening March 5th, when another capacity congregation is expected to attend the Ma'ariv service which again will be turned over to the young men of our congregational family. The evening service as well as the reading of the Megillah will be entrusted to the capable hands of students from our Ramaz School.

The practice of having our own young men read the Purim Scroll has become one of the highly anticipated events of our Synagogue year. Introduced several years ago, it has received city-wide acclaim, and has been instrumental in bringing to our Synagogue larger congregations with every passing year.

Purim is a holiday with special appeal for youngsters and we urge all our members and friends to be sure to bring their children with them. The pupils of Ramaz School and of our afternoon Religious School will also be our guests and all the children will be given noise-makers to accompany the reading of the Megillah.

A wonderful time is in store for those who attend the service and all are invited to join us Wednesday evening, March 5th, in ushering in the joyful holiday of Purim. The Ma'ariv service will begin at 6:00 P.M.

NORMAN ATKINS TO SING AT MARCH 10th SISTERHOOD MEETING

"Israel In Song" with Norman Atkins, noted baritone, will be featured at the Sisterhood meeting of Monday, March 10th. Sisterhood President, Mrs. Oscar Perlberger has appointed Mrs. Martin Markson chairman of the program.

Mr. Atkins is a widely known and experienced young artist who has had a distinguished career in synagogue music as well as in opera, concerts, and the stage. He has appeared with the NBC-TV Opera, the Hallmark Hall of Fame, and in various TV and theatrical musical variety shows. Mr. Atkins has also appeared as soloist with the New York Philharmonic, the Boston Symphony, the Cleveland Symphony, Thomas Scherman's Little Orchestra

Society, and numerous other leading American symphony orchestras.

Critics have acclaimed our guest artist as a "brilliant and glorious baritone" and as one who sings "with sensitivity and musical intelligence."

The program to be presented for our Sisterhood has been specially designed to present representative samplings of Jewish vocal music that captures the spirit and meaning of Jewish life in Israel, in America, in Europe, and elsewhere. Mr. Atkins' songs will be sung in Hebrew, Yiddish and English, and he will offer his own explanatory commentary.

EDUCATOR'S COUNCIL ORGANIZED

The Metropolitan New York Commission on Talmud Torah Education sponsored by the Yeshiva University Synagogue Council and affiliated with the Jewish Education Committee of New York is one of the more encouraging developments in Jewish education in recent years. The commission has proceeded slowly and carefully and has now organized traditional Religious Schools in several areas of the city into regional groups.

At the present time the commission has prepared a core curriculum for Chumash which will completely revise the study of Chumash in Religious Schools. Other curricula are also being planned.

In addition to this work, regional groups within the Metropolitan commission have organized Hebrew High Schools for those students who wish to enter the Yeshiva University High Schools.

Continuing its pattern of growth an Educators Council was formally organized last Sunday at a meeting at Stern College for Women. Dr. Zevve Harris was elected President of the Council. Rabbi Hollander was named Regional Vice President of Manhattan.

Members of our congregation have been active in the commission since its inception. The Chairman of the Board is our own Dr. Victor Wouk. It will be interesting to follow the continued growth of the commission and its contributions to the furtherance of Jewish Education.
