CONGREGANTS RESPOND GENEROUSLY TO YESHIVA UNIVERSITY APPEAL

SEDER SERVICES

Once again we are conducting a Congregational Seder on both nights of the Passover holiday. Letters, with reservation blanks, were sent out to the entire membership. In those letters we informed all our friends that there will be no follow-ups of any kind. We feel that those who are interested will take advantage of the opportunity that is offered to them, without any pressure on our part.

Reservations for the Seder nights must be made no later than Friday, March 28th. No reservations will be accepted after that date.

Close to \$25,000 was contributed by our congregants last Saturday morning at a service dedicated to Yeshiva University. These funds go towards the maintenance of the institution and especially towards the very generous scholarship aid program of the school. The occasion served as a testimonial to Dr. Samuel Belkin, distinguished president of Yeshiva University, who is one of the trustees of the congrega-

tion. He was greatly moved by the tribute paid to him and by the devotion of Kehilath Jesurun to Yeshiva University.

The appeal was conducted with the usual dignity and propriety familiar to our congregants. No public announcements, no pressures, no direct solicitations were resorted to and yet

Yeshiva University now comprises 17 different schools and divisions at six major teaching centers with an enrollment of more than 3,000 men and women from all parts of the U.S. and abroad. Yeshiva Universitys overall budget exceeds \$3,000,000 with a \$750,000 Scholarship Fund, providing tuition, dormitory and maintenance assistance for more than 2,600 students.

While the Synagogue was well filled, nevertheless there were some who for one reason or another could not be present. We know that they would like to participate in this effort in behalf of the foremost institution of higher learning in the land. We will be very happy to hear from them. UPTURN IN ECONOMY EXPECTED IN TWO MONTHS Says Stock Analyst at Men's Club Meeting

Mr. Lewis Schellbach, Vice-president of Standard and Poor's Corporation, a leading economic research and analysis firm, discussed "The General Business Outlook" at the monthly meeting of the Men's Club, last Monday evening.

Mr. Schellbach opened his talk with a forecast: The current recession will reach its low point in the next month or two. After that time, business will begin to recover.

A chart based on estimates of the Council of Economic Advisors, analyzing national income, gross national product, and other components of the economic structure was presented to the audience. On the basis of a detailed comparative analysis of these figures for 1956, 1957 and estimates for 1958, Mr. Schellbach arrived at his encouraging conclusion.

A question and answer session followed the formal presentation, and Mr. Schellbach's reasons and conclusions were subjected to close scrutiny.

A graduate of Columbia University, Mr. Schellbach is now in his-thirtieth year with Standard & Poor's Corporation. He has worked his way through most departments in that corporation, from inquiry correspondent to editor of its most important service.

He is Vice-President in charge of all printed advisory services and director of economic research. In the latter post, he was one of the few economists who during the war foretold the postwar boom. His study entitled "Victory is Bullish," was in direct conflict with the commonly held view that the war would be followed by a severe depression.
