The officers of the Sisterhood who were seated on the dais were then introduced.



## PASSOVER SUPPLEMENT

### PASSOVER NOTES

There are several important matters that should be borne in mind during the Passover season.

#### "Kosher for Passover" —

A label bearing the inscription, "Kosher for Passover" is not necessarily a guarantee that the article so labeled is permissible for Passover use. Unfortunately, there are the unscrupulous who take advantage, and the credulous who fall prey. Whatever food article, therefore, that is purchased for Passover and which requires endorsement should indicate that it has the approval of a recognized rabbi or rabbinic organization.

#### Search for Chometz —

On Thursday evening, April 3rd, every Jewish home should be inspected to make sure that all "chometz" has been removed. Like every religious practice, there is a ceremony connected with this inspection. It is well to observe that ceremony, not alone because it is a religious requirement, but because it affords an opportunity to impress the children of every household.

#### Sale of Chometz —

The important ritual of "m'chiras chometz" (the sale of chometz) must be attended to by Friday, April 4th. Rabbi Lookstein will be available for this purpose during the pre-Passover week beginning Monday, March 31st. For those who cannot come in person, we provide a form, in this bulletin, which must be properly filled out, signed and returned to the Rabbi no later than Friday, April 4th.

#### Disposal of Chometz —

No chometz may be eaten after 9:30 A.M. on Friday, April 4th. All chometz should be completely disposed of by 10:30 Friday morning.

#### Service for the First-Born —

It is obligatory upon every first-born who cannot observe the fast on Friday, April 4th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate at its conclusion, in the light collation that is served. The services for the first-born (Siyum Bechorim) will be held in the Chapel on Friday, April 4th, as part of the regular morning service which will begin at 7:30.

### SALE OF CHOMETZ

During Passover, no chometz is permitted to remain in the possession of a Jew. To fulfill the requirements of Jewish law, this chometz may be sold. Such a sale is conducted by the Rabbi who must first receive authorization to perform that task. For your convenience, the form below may be used.
