# BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE IN PREPARATION FOR SHAVUOTH

The 1958-1959 volume of the Book of Remembrance is now in preparation and will be ready for use by our worshippers for the Shavuoth Festival. Since its origin several years ago, it has become an institution in Kehilath Jeshurun.

Members of our congregational family are aware of the important role the Book of Remembrance plays and the use to which it is put at the four Yizkor services during the year. Briefly, the volume itself contains a listing of departed ones to be memorialized, with an appropriate memorial prayer.

In order to be consistent with the Yizkor pledge, in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made, an opportunity is given to our congregants to make their Yizkor offering every year before the Shavuoth holidays. In this manner the names of the departed are included in a volume which is placed in the hands of worshippers at the various memorial services during the year.

In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering it has been limited to no more than ten dollars and no less than five dollars for each name to be memorialized. Thus the offering is purged of any material tinge and represents purely a token of reverence for the departed.

You have by now received correspondence from the Synagogue office concerning the 1958 Book of Remembrance. Since the task of preparing the volume is an exacting one, it is requested that you return the Authorization Card listing the names of those to be included in the Book without delay.

# RELIGIOUS SCHOOL, RAMAZ TO MARK ISRAEL ANNIVERSARY
