

FINAL MEN'S CLUB MEETING TO HEAR ATTORNEY GENERAL LEFKOWITZ

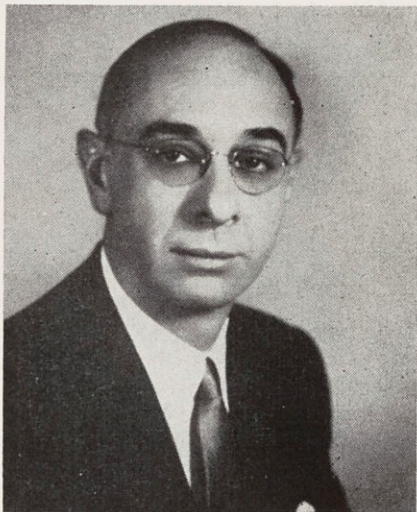
On Tuesday evening, May 20th, the Men's Club of the Congregation will hold its final meeting of the season. The highlight of the evening will be an address by the Honorable Louis J. Lefkowitz, Attorney General of the State of New York.

Long active in public office Mr. Lefkowitz has served as a member of the Assembly in the New York State Legislature and has held such positions as Justice of the Municipal Court of the City of New York, Counsel to the New York State Joint Legislative Committee to Recodify and Revise Election laws as well as Justice of the City Court of New York.

As a member of the Assembly he authored such legislation as the Anti-Injunction Law, several Child Welfare laws and laws designed to put "loan sharks" out of business.

He has actively supported institution of a merit system in the schools, aid to war veterans and emergency rent laws.

In addition to being a member of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York and the Federal Bar Association of New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, Mr. Lefkowitz has also taken a vigorous role in communal activities. He is a general chairman of New York 1958 Campaign of

UJA and vice-chairman of its Lawyers Division. He is also on the Manhattan Committee for Bonds for Israel and the Eastern Regional Chairman of the City of Hope National Medical Center. He also numbers among his activities membership in various Religious, Scientific and Fraternal organizations.

The meeting will culminate a successful year of activity in the Men's Club, and election of officers will be held at that time. Members of the Men's Club are requested to bring their wives to this meeting.

In addition to these positions Mr. Cohen has sat on the executive boards of the National Jewish Music Council, National Council of Jewish Audio-Visual Materials and was a member of the Informal Committee on Programming for the Jewish Tercentenary Celebration in 1954.

As a specialist in Youth Activity programming we look to Mr. Cohen with anticipation for an augmented activities program for our young people during the coming season.
