HASKEL LOOKSTEIN ELECTED ASSISTANT TO RABBI LOOKSTEIN

Trustees Take Action on Eve of Rabbinic Ordination Inaugural Sermon on June 14th

Haskel Lookstein, son of Rabbi and Mrs. Joseph H. Lookstein, was elected by the Board of Trustees as assistant to his father. The Board of Trustees took this action at a meeting held on Monday, May 19th. The meeting took place at the Lookstein residence, where it is annually held at this time in order to launch the Annual Synagogue Appeal of the Congregation.

The action represented a historic event in the annals of Kehilath Jeshurun. It came on the eve of the ordination ceremonies at which Haskel Lookstein will receive the traditional Smicha from the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, the Rabbinic School of Yeshiva University. The nomination was made by Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University and a trustee of the Congregation. Dr. Belkin spoke in praise of the young rabbi as a student, as a talented preacher and as a spiritual leader of great promise.

Mr. Max J. Etra, who, as President of the Congregation, presided at the meeting, called for someone to second the nomination. Then, it is reported, something most unusual occurred.

Everyone among those present seconded the nomination with a few appropriate remarks. Following these brief seconding speeches, the election was unanimous.

The historic character of this event is extremely striking. Rabbi M. S. Margolis, the great-grandfather of Haskel Lookstein, graced the rabbinate of Kehilath Jeshurun for thirty-one years. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, a grandson by marriage, then succeeded him. Now comes Haskel Lookstein to assist his father. To have a grandfather, a grandson and a great-grandson as rabbinic functionaries in the same congregation is, indeed, a most unusual occurrence.

Haskel Lookstein was literally brought up in Kehilath Jeshurun. He became Bar Mitzva in our synagogue. He attended Ramaz School and graduated from its high school as one of his class valedictorians. He is now pursuing courses towards his masters degree at the graduate school of Yeshiva University. He has held High Holiday posts for the last few years in several important synagogues in
