RELIGIOUS SCHOOL GREETES NEW PRINCIPAL AT FINAL ASSEMBLY

The Religious School of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun held its final assembly program last Friday in the Social Hall of the Synagogue. OUR SERVICES DURING THE SUMMER
