### INSPIRING SERVICES HELD ON TISHA B'AV

Over 100 men and women crowded the Synagogue's Chapel for the Saturday Evening Tisha B'Av Service, reading of Lamentations and Kinoth.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein set the mood for the service with a brief review of the significance of the Fast Day and an outline of the Jewish Laws pertaining to Tisha B'Av. The reading of Lamentations, led by our Assistant Rabbi and closely followed by the Congregants, was an impressive and moving experience.

Selected passages from the Talmud and Jewish history which had particular relevance were read, and a brief statement of authorship and explanation was offered before each of the Kinoth recited in the evening and morning services.

The mood of the day reflected a spirit of mourning for past tragedies and hope for a future national redemption.
