Once again, the officers of the congregation conferred Torah honors upon three deserving and esteemed sons of Kehilath Jeshurun. William Lebowitz has been appointed "Chasan-Torah," Elgin Shulsky will be "Chasan-Bereshith," and young B. Warren Brown has been chosen as "Chasan-Maftir."

William Lebowitz is one of the quiet, unassuming, yet one of the most active and devoted members of the congregation. Together with his wife, who is an important leader in the Sisterhood, he cherishes deep affection for Kehilath Jeshurun. Even their son, young Elliot, has caught the spirit and is an energetic member of the Board of Ushers.

The Chasan-Torah is a graduate of New York University and of its Law School. He is the Treasurer of the Men's Club and an Associate Trustee of the congregation. He is generous towards every cause, and there is hardly a Yeshiva University function at which he is not present.

Regular Sabbath services for our young people will begin on Saturday October 11th in the Chapel. As has been the practice in the past, children will gather at 10:30 under the leadership of Franklin Holzer and will conduct their own youth service. The young people will assume the positions of cantor, will read the Torah and will act as ushers. Your youngster will find this youth service a happy place to make his initial acquaintance with the Sabbath liturgy. Of course, a Kiddush will be served following the service.

Father and Son Minyan

This year will mark the eleventh consecutive year of the Father and Son Minyan. Under the sponsorship of the Men's Club, the Father and Son Minyan will hold its initial session on Sunday, October 19th at 9:30 A.M. in the Synagogue Chapel.

This activity in the past has met with a great deal of success. It has afforded fathers an opportunity to pray together with their children at a weekday service when parents are free of their normal business responsibilities and other obligations. As in the past, it will be an occasion for all to join in a communal breakfast. At the close of the service everyone will have an opportunity to enjoy a period of athletic activities in the gymnasium.

Youth Groups

The youth groups during the coming year will encompass a large age range. The plans now call for a junior group for grade school children, an intermediate group for high school youth, and a senior group for collegiates and past collegiates. The groups will meet regularly in order to maintain a healthy social and cultural program under competent leadership.

A Time to be Young

On Monday night, October 6th the accent in our congregation will be on youth. From the time that Mincha begins at 5:30 P.M. until the benediction at the close of Ma'ariv young people of all ages will participate in the rejoicing over the completion of the Law. If you feel young at heart, you won't want to miss this occasion.

A special young cantor will read the Mincha services. Young children will serve as Junior Marshals, marching in front of each procession of the Torahs. Young ushers will provide an impromptu choir to supplement the Cantor's Ma'ariv service. Young voices of all ranges and ages will chant the traditional melodies of Simchat Torah. In short, the celebration marking the completion of the Torah will be "A Time to Be Young".

In order to enable the services to run smoothly, we would like to call your attention to a number of items.

 Come with your families but please refrain from bringing children under 4 years to the synagogue. Experience has shown that their limited attention span works a hardship upon the children themselves and upon the adults who would like to enjoy the proceedings.

- Please bring the children to the Synagogue Chapel on time – not later than 5:45 P.M. Please also be good enough not to bring them before 5:30 P.M. since a long wait will only make them restless.
- 3) Paraphrasing a well known commercial statement: "Don't make a fuss; leave their care to us." Competent leaders will be in charge of the children and are equipped to deal with any and all of their needs.

After the benediction you may pick up your children in the main synagogue lobby (downstairs) after they have received the special sweets which constitute so vital a part of the Simchath Torah tradition.

Remember the schedule: Mincha at 5:30 P.M., children not before 5:30 P.M. and not after 5:45 P.M. Come and participate in the festivities.
