## ADULT INSTITUTE OPENS

Wednesday Classes to Begin This Week

This Wednesday evening, October 29th at 8:00 P.M. sessions will begin at the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute. The Institute, which has been holding sessions for the past several years with ever increasing success, is designed to bring to its students the finest opportunities in Adult Jewish Education.

Sessions will start this Wednesday for the three regular weekly classes which will continue to meet until Passover. The first of these, the Talmud class, actually began last week preceding the formal opening of the Institute.

## Classes in Hebrew

Two new classes will begin the study of Hebrew this week. Both classes are designed to give their students a knowledge of Hebrew in the form of reading, comprehension and speech. One class is an elementary one for those who either have no knowledge of Hebrew, or whose acquaintance with the language is extremely limited. It will be taught by Mr. Joseph Fuchs, the Principal of the Park East Religious School.

The second class is an intermediate one for students who have already attained some level of fluency in reading and possess a reasonable degree of comprehension. It will be taught once again by Mrs. Alice Rothkowitz,

an instructor at the Park East Religious School. Mrs. Rothkowitz has met with considerable success in teaching this class for the past few years.

It need hardly be added that many of our members would benefit greatly from these classes. They will enable a student to read and understand the prayers. They will render a trip to Israel more enjoyable and rewarding, and they will equip a mother or father to appreciate what their children learn in school in their religious studies.

## Lecture Series Begins Next Week

In addition to the weekly classes, the Institute will offer a lecture on the first Wednesday of every month from November through April. The general topic will be "A Historical Portrait of the Jew." Six different lecturers will discuss the various periods of Jewish History from Abraham until the establishment of the State of Israel. The first lecture will be given by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein (the only "non-professional" among the six) on Wednesday, November 5th at 9:00 P.M. His topic will be "2000 B.C.E.-586 B.C.E. The Birth and Growth of a People." The lectures are open to all our readers and their friends.
