Mizrachi Hatzair Seniors

Our collegiates and post collegiates (under the age of twenty-six) are invited to attend the Mid-Manhattan Chapter of Mizrachi Hatzair which will nold its regular bi-weekly meetings in our Social Hall. The opening meeting is this Sunday evening, November 9, at 7:30 P.M. Featured on the program is an excellent film, showing a tour of the Brussels World's Fair, Jerusalem, the Negev, as well as a thrilling sequence of maneuvers by Israeli jet bombers. This is a splendid opportunity for our young people to join a group which promises to offer much, culturally, spiritually, and socially.

Cub Scouts

Once again this year the Men's Club is sponsoring a Cub Scout Pack which will meet every Tuesday night in the gymnasium. The first meeting will be on Tuesday night, November 18, at 7:00 P.M.
