Collegiate Sabbath to Honor Our Youth

This Saturday marks the beginning of the winter vacation for students on the elementary, high school, collegiate, and post collegiate levels. The next two weeks will be marked by the presence of many young men and women from out of town. Even our "in towners" will be more easily perceived as the young intellectuals emerge from under a pile of books, free themselves from papers and exams, and once again become the focus of attention in our community.

Collegiate Sabbath Next Week —

Foremost among these activities are regular Sabbath services. There are three Sabbaths during the vacation period, and we hope our young people will find the time to worship with us during these coming weeks. We shall try to honor each of our young men by calling them to the Torah during this period. The highlight of these vacation Sabbaths will be our Annual Collegiate Sabbath devoted entirely to the Collegiate Sabbath set in our Community. Torah honors will be delegated to the young collegiates and appropriate corsages will be distributed to the "collegiettes".

At the close of services, the entire Congregation will hear a symposium conducted by a member of our collegiate community at which three young panelists will discuss the topic,

"The Student at College—Problems of Adjustment". At the conclusion of the symposium we will all be guests of the Sisterhood and Men's Club of the Congregation at a special Buffet Kiddush.

In the afternoon the Sabbath Seudah Seminar will be led by two young people discussing the topic: "A Collegiate Reads the Weekly Portion". You will certainly not want to miss any part of this "total Sabbath Program" which promises to be an inspiring one.
