# KEHILATH JESHURUN YEAR BOOK WARMLY RECEIVED Dedicated to Tenth Anniversary of State of Israel.

#### RECORD ATTENDANCE HEARS DR. AGUS' INSTITUTE LECTURE

Adult education at Kehilath Jeshurun has arrived. Last Wednesday, January 7th the largest crowd in the history of the Adult Institute Open Lecture Series braved the sixteen degree temperature to attend the third lecture on "A Historical Portrait of the Jew."

Some ninety students listened with close attention as Dr. Irving Agus, professor of Jewish history at Yeshiva University, discussed the backgrounds of Medieval Jewry. He showed how present day Ashkenazic Jewry is almost entirely descended from a group of Jews, ten thousand strong, living in Central Europe in the ninth century.

The lecturer went on to explain how the forces of "historical selection" operated to equip these ten thousand for their task of multiplying approximately one thousand fold during ten centuries of turbulent world history. The actual methods employed by this group to succeed in their monumental achievement will form the subject for the next lecture of the series.

There is no doubt that the ninety participants in this past lecture will return to hear Dr. Agus complete the second part of his analysis. If by chance you missed the first part, make a note of the next date. It will be an educational experience to be treasured by you for a long time. The 1958 Year Book is already in the hands of our congregants, advertisers and well-wishers. As usual, it is rich in content and beautiful in appearance. Early reactions to this, the eighteenth edition of congregational Year Books, are extremely enthusiastic and highly complimentary.

The volume contains a detailed account of the congregational activities of the past year. The message of the officers of the Congregation and of the heads of the various Standing Committees, as well as of the Presidents of the Men's Club and Sisterhood, are included. The highlights of the year form part of an article entitled "The Synagogue Year in Review" and should make interesting reading not alone for our congregants but for every student of the current Jewish scene.

An entire section is devoted to the Jewish calendar. Within that section, there is a record of all the Yahrzeit dates observed by members of our Congregation.

#### Special Features -

In this volume one will find a sermon by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein entitled "The Good Life", which he delivered at Rosh Hashanah time.

Another feature is the pictorial album which forms part of this volume. In that section one will find interesting photographs, sketches in pen and word, depicting the record of the first (continued on Page 2)
