November 22, 1878

In an article in "The Jewish Messenger": "Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun holds weekly Sabbath services in Parepa Hall, Yorkville." Mr. S. E. Hart, who is a member, delivered a very touching sermon lately to an audience of over three hundred persons, and is now the regular lecturer of the congregation.

September 21, 1883

The following advertisement appeared in "The American Hebrew". "Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun; 82nd Street near Lexington Avenue. The new building of this congregation will be ready for services for the holidays and seats can now be secured. The building is in an excellent location. Prices for seats are \$5, \$3, \$2 according to location." (ed. note: Perhaps that is why they are called the "good old days".)
