### FATHER AND SON MINYAN IN FINAL TWO WEEKS

#### WILLIAM LEBOWITZ TO BE HONORED

As its season draws to a close the Father and Son Minyan has scheduled two final services to mark the conclusion of the year.

#### Sunday, April 5th

This will be Father's Sunday at the Minyan. Traditionally, on that day the sons take a back seat and the fathers carry their hand in the cantorial arts. This year we have four men who have hardly missed a service all year. They will now have an opportunity to show what they have learned during the course of the year.

The cantors will be: Abraham L. Holzer, William Lebowitz, Max Shor, and Dr. Victor Wouk. Come down this Sunday at 9:30 and give them the moral support they deserve and, perhaps, may need.

#### Sunday, April 12th.

This will be "Bill Lebowitz Sunday" at the minyan. We will honor the man who has been chairman of this Men's Club project for the past five years. Most faithful in his attendance he is deserving of a fine tribute. Your presence will be such a tribute. Please come and bring your friends.

At a beautiful service held last Saturday, close to thirty thousand dollars was contributed by our congregation to the maintenance and scholarship fund of Yeshiva University.

The guest of honor at the Testimonial Sabbath was Dr. Samuel Belkin, distinguished president of the University and esteemed trustee of our Congregation. This year marks the Fifteenth Anniversary of Dr. Belkin's presidency of the institution. The one regrettable fact was that the guest of honor could not be present because of illness to enjoy the tribute of our worshippers and their warm response to Yeshiva.

The appeal was conducted with the dignity and propriety familiar to our congregation. There were no public announcements, no pressures and no direct solicitations. Yet the response of our worshippers was most heart-warming.

Yeshiva University now comprises seventeen schools, divisions and institutes. There are more than four thousand students enrolled in the institution. Its budget is seven million dollars a year. Its Rabbinical school is the biggest in the country. This week one hundred and twenty young Rabbis were ordained by it at the triennial convocation held on Sunday.

**HAL LEHRMAN THRILLS  
MEN'S CLUB AUDIENCE**

Last Thursday evening an audience of men and women sat enthralled while Hal Lehrman discussed the turbulent Middle East. The only way to describe the lecture is to outline it at least in part.

Mr. Lehrman showed the systematic decline of Nasser during the past year, marked by the independence of Kasim's Iraq, the maintenance of power in Jordan by Hussein, and the internal struggle for independence in Syria which only now is becoming evident.

Our lecturer fresh from a ten month tour of the Middle East showed the bankruptcy of our State Department's policy of appeasement in the area. Illustrating his thesis factually, he asserted: "In this area a great nation cannot make its way through prayers and dreams but rather through strength, courage and resolution." The latter policy has been followed by Israel, a country which has incurred the hatred of the Arabs; a hatred which is matched only by their respect for her power and firmness.

Much of what Mr. Lehrman said is too confidential to record in print. Suffice it to say that those who heard him came away with a greater understanding of the complexities which exist in this section of the world which constitutes the cradle of civilization.
