DR. BERNARD LANDER ADDRESSES ADULT INSTITUTE

Last week an enthusiastic audience heard Dr. Bernard Lander director of the Bernard Revel Graduate School at Yeshiva University discuss the topic "Modern Jewish Life — A Continuous Struggle for Survival".

In this final lecture of our Adult Institute Open Lecture Series, over seventy-five students heard Dr. Lander distinguish between the various approaches to the solution of the "Jewish Problem". He discussed the solutions of assimilation, isolation, nationalism, and integration. This last approach of integration represents the contribution of Samson Raphael Hirsch who was the architect of Modern Orthodox Judaism, a movement which advocates the integration of the knowledge, values, and spirit of the Torah with the intellectual climate of modern life. Its formula is succinctly contained in the slogan of Yeshiva University - "Torah and Science".

Dr. Lander provided a fitting climax to a wonderful Adult Lecture series. The average attendance at our six lectures was over eighty. On one occasion we had as many as one hundred and ten. Some twenty students attended all six lectures and thereby received credit for this course from the Yeshiva University Department of Adult Education.

Our Adult Institute is coming to an end for this season. The last sessions of the three regular classes will be held this Wednesday evening. In a future issue of the Bulletin we will summarize our achievements and present the roster of students.
