The Ethics of the Fathers is a basic tractate of the Talmud which concerns itself with Jewish ethics, values, and philosophy. There is perhaps no other book in the Talmud which possesses such simplicity and directness on the one hand, and depth of thought and insight on the other.

Begin the course this Saturday afternoon at 6:40. Make it a family affair. You will find that the Sabbath will be much more enjoyable for your effort.

# SUMMER TALMUD CLASS BEGINS NEXT WEDNESDAY

On Wednesday evening, May 6th, at 8:00 o'clock the Talmud class will begin its summer session. The class will continue thereafter to meet weekly from 8:00 to 9:15 P.M., under the tutelage of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein.

The Tractate to be studied is Beizah, a book which deals largely with the laws, customs, and spirit of Yom Tov. The Winter Session completed one unit of study revolving around the concept of Muktzah (objects forbidden to be moved on Sabbath and holidays). The Summer Session will deal with the positive feature of Yom Tov, the joy which a Jew must experience on festivals.

If you have not availed yourself of the opportunity to study Talmud in the class during the winter, why not begin this new session now. You will receive credit from the Yeshiva University Department of Adult Education and you will no doubt enjoy the experience of probing into the essence of Jewish observance and thought.
