First, the class is conducted in English and the subject matter is intelligible to all regardless of their educational background.

Secondly, the material covered has relevance to everyone's personal life. Each student is able to find information and instruction which relate to his daily affairs. Furthermore, the ethical concepts contained in this tractate of the Talmud are fundamental to Judaism's view of man's relationships with his fellow man and with himself.

Finally, the class provides a stimulating interlude in the long summer Sabbath afternoons. Men and women find the experience of learning satisfying and the Mincha service which follows, inspiring.

K. J. Archives BENEVOLENCE UNLIMITED

On September 21, 1943 the Men's Club of Kehilath Jeshurun began issuing a monthly bulletin. The "Men's Club Monthly" continued to be published regularly for some four years.

In its opening issue there appears an article by Ira F. Weisman, president, in which he sets forth the threefold purpose of the Men's Club to foster "Brotherhood, Faith, and Benevolence".

It is interesting to note the progress which has been achieved by the Men's Club in the last area, benevolence. In the year 1943-44, when Men's Club activity was at its height only \$1234.25 was allotted for charitable contributions.

By comparison, the year 1958-59 has been marked by the following expenditures for benevolent purposes: Ramaz School \$1500; Park East Religious School \$1500; Father and Son Minyan \$750; Prayer Books \$272; Collegiate Sabbath \$140; a Cub Pack \$100; and miscellaneous contributions \$200.

We note with pride the increased benevolent activity of the Men's Club without its becoming essentially a fund raising organization.

Like its male counterpart, the Sisterhood has grown in the dimension of Benevolence. Records for the year 1944 are incomplete, but this year the Sisterhood has already distributed over \$3500 to charitable causes. This sum will yet be increased when the proceeds from the Theatre Party become available.

Such is the growth in our congregation of Brotherhood, Sisterhood, Faith and Benevolence.
