Sisterhood Donor Luncheon to Cap Glorious Season

Record Turnout Anticipated this Wednesday at Savoy Hilton

The highlight of the season for the Sisterhood of Kehilath Jeshurun is always the Annual Donor Luncheon. This year the Luncheon will be held this coming Wednesday, March 30th at the Savoy Hilton Hotel, 5th Avenue and 58th Street.

The Luncheon promises to be a marvelous affair. There is a strong possibility that the attendance will surpass last year's record gathering. If so, then the philanthropic program of the Sisterhood will be greatly enhanced.

Four Areas Served

The proceeds from this luncheon will be allocated to four different charitable causes. A substantial sum will be given to the Ramaz Scholarship Fund. Another portion will go to the Park East Religious School, the community Talmud Torah with which our congregation is so intimately associated. A third benficiary of the luncheon will be the Sisterhood Camp Fund, a special project of the women which enables needy children to enjoy a few weeks of recreation away from the city during the hot summer months. Finally, the luncheon proceeds will also be used for the Neediest Cases Fund. This Fund is a special one which helps a few deserving families in our community when economic pressures are particularly severe.

The Program

The program for the affair will, as in the past, be a stimulating one. Mrs. Meyer Texon will, of course, preside. Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will deliver the invocation. Greetings will be delivered by Max J. Etra for the congregation and Elgin Shulsky for the Men's Club. The featured speaker will be Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein.

CLASS IN COMMANDMENTS CONCLUDES THIS SATURDAY

This Saturday afternoon, at 5:10, the class in Commandments of Judaism will hold its final session of the year. The class will discuss the positive command of: "Remember the Sabbath Day to Keep It Holy" and the negative ordinance: "Thou shalt do no manner of work on the Sabbath Day."

This class has been meeting regularly with Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, every Saturday since October, fifty minutes before Mincha. During that time about fifteen different commandments have been discussed and analyzed as they occur in the portions of the week from the Torah. The source studied was the Sefer HaChinuch.

With the approach of Passover, this class will terminate in favor of a two week study of the holiday laws. Following the holiday, the Sabbath Class will return to study the Ethics of the Fathers.

If you have not attended the Class in Commandments heretofore, come this week to the final session so that you will know what to expect when next year, we will resume the study of these essentials of Judaism.
