

# ADULT INSTITUTE LECTURE WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 4

#### Dr. Norman B. Frimer Guest Lecturer

The third installment in the Adult Institute Open Lecture Series, on the general subject "Problems and Personalities in Jewish Philosophy", will be forthcoming on Wednesday evening, January 4, 1961. Our guest lecturer that evening will be Dr. Norman B. Frimer. He will discuss the "Philosophy of Yehudah HaLevi" under the general heading: "Can we talk to God?"

In the first two installments of our series we heard of Saadia Gaon's rationalistic interpretation of Jewish Philosophy and of Maimonides' analysis of Jewish Ethics. In the forthcoming lecture we will hear a discussion of a more emotional approach to God. Yehudah HaLevi, the great poet and philosopher of medieval Spain distinguished between the God of the Philosophers and the God of Abraham, the abstract God of pure reason and the concrete and the loving God of the Encounter.

Rabbi Frimer is eminently qualified to discuss this subject. A man of exceptional scholarship, he is the director of the Hillel activities for all colleges in the metropolitan area. He has had wide experience in addressing all kinds of audiences on subjects of a philosophic nature.

Three years ago in our congregation he delivered a series of lectures for the Adult Institute which were received warmly and enthusiastically. His lecture on Wednesday, January 4, will, no doubt, be similarly received.

Members and friends of the congregational family are invited to attend this lecture which will begin at 9 o'clock.

# HEADLINES OF JEWISH INTEREST

Arab Diploma Elite

The 60 member Arab Student Association at Wayne State University in Detroit refused to take part in a "Middle Eastern Night" because Israeli students at the University were scheduled to participate in the discussions. Samir Zakhem, Lebanese President of the Arab Students Association, said the group does not recognize Israel and would, therefore, not participate in program on political divisions in the Middle Esat. (One questions the value of education when it fails to prevent such bigotry. ed. note)

Algerian Rebels Sack Synagogue

The ancient synagogue in the Casbah of Algiers was desecrated and wrecked last week by Moslem rebels. A Torah was ripped into shreds and the parchment was left lying on the dcorstep. Many Jewish homes and shops were attacked as well. These antisemetic outbursts were apparently an outlet for anti-French hatred. It seems that when a Moslem throws a stone at a Frenchman a Jew is struck, a situation reminiscent of the late nineteenth century in Russia and Poland.

Arab Boycott Backfires

The Khedivail Mail Line of Alexandria, Egypt which had been operating three ships between Alexandria and the United States East Coast has cancelled all future sailings to the United States in order to avoid further boycott against the line by the International Seafarers Union. The union has threatened to continue picketing the company's ships in the manner in which it picketed the Cleopatra last summer. The line is also resigning from the membership in the North Atlantic Shipping Conference due to the cancellation of the sailings to and from the United States East Coast.

### Dean Rusk considered friendly to Israel

Dean Rusk, the Secretary of State Designate, is considered by informed circles to be friendly to the interests of Israel. In 1947 as director of the State Department's Office of Special Political Affairs, he was entrusted with formulating United States policies in the United Nations. This was the period during which the United States backed the Palestine Partition Plan.

#### THE WEEKLY PORTIONS

#### Vavigash Genesis 44:18-47:27

The portion opens with an impassioned plea on the part of Judah for the fate of Benjamin. This speech constitutes one of the great statements in Biblical literature.

The greater part of the portion is devoted to the reunion of Joseph with his brothers and with his father Jacob. The entire family settles in the area of Goshen where they tend their flocks. They are received royally by Pharoah and treated in every way as V.I.P.'s.

#### Vayehi Genesis 47:28-50:26

This portion marks the conclusion of the Book of Genesis. The outstanding feature of it is the farewell address of Jacob to his children, an address of praise, encouragement, prophecy, and occasionally of chastisement.

The portion marks the end of an era. Judaism has had its beginnings as a patriarichal society marked by the three Fathers of the Jewish people. Henceforth the family of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob will pass through the cauldron of Egyptian slavery and emerge as the children of Israel a nation destined to become a Kingdom of priests and holy people.
