# "HE WHO MOURNS THE DESTRUCTION OF JERUSALEM WILL YET REJOICE IN ITS RESURRECTION". (Ta'anit 30b)

The above expression of the Talmud constitutes a major reason for the observance of Tisha B'Av. The mourning over the destruction of the Temple and a homeland is not a manifestation of national morbidness. It has, rather, a positive purpose: to fix the impression of national desolation upon our minds and, thereby, to plant the seeds from which will develop national rebirth.

Our generation is fully aware of the accuracy of this Talmudic judgment. We have been privileged to witness the embryonic stages of rebirth in Israel. We have seen the fulfillment of our longing for Jerusalem — a longing which was expressed in tears, in mourning and in fasting.

When a people finds its soul muted while trying "to sing the Lord's song in a strange land", when a people "sits down by the waters of Babylon," the Tiber, the Rhine, the Vistula, and the Dnieper and weeps; when a people interrupts its most joyous family celebrations to break a glass as a sign of sadness; when a people greets its mourners with the expression: "May God comfort you among all of us who mourn for Zion and Jerusalem;" such a people is privileged to return to its land in gladness and in joy.

The re-establishment of the State of Israel, however, does not obviate the need for national mourning. Tisha B'Av commemorates more than the fall of a state. It symbolizes the destruction of a Temple and with it the loss of a religious center which gave stability and direction to Judaism. It represents the collapse of the Bar Kochba revolt, the expulsion of the Jews from Spain, the agony of 2000 years in exile, and, most recently, the brutal extermination of six million Jews during the reign of Nazism in Europe.

"For all this I weep; from my eyes there flows a torrent of tears." This was the expression of Jeremiah when he witnessed the fall of Jerusalem. It is still our declaration, 2547 years later, as we observe the Fast of the Ninth of Av in the year 1961.
