### **CBS THANKS** RABBI JOSEPH LOOKSTEIN

On the Sunday following the assassination of President Kennedy, Rabbi Lookstein participated in a one hour broadcast over the CBS network together with six other clergymen of all faiths. This week, the Rabbi received a letter from Dr. Frank Stanton, president of the Columbia Broadcasting System. The letter reads as follows:

"I am certain that I speak for millions of families throughout the country as well as for the Columbia Broadcasting System when I say that your participation in our special broadcast November 24 was deeply appreciated. We are most grateful for your contribution toward a more fully informed nation during a dark and anxious period."

In addition, the Rabbi has received countless messages of every variety from all parts of the country in appreciation of his part in that historic broadcast.

# THE WEEKLY PORTION SHABBAT CHANUKAH

"We Recognize Thee"

Throughout the Festival of Chanukah, we recite in our daily prayers and in the Grace after Meals, the passage known as Al ha-Nissim. This passage appears in the thanksgiving part of the service and the Grace after Meals. It indicates our gratitude to God for the miracles which he wrought in the victory of the Maccabees over the Greeks and in the triumph of Judaism over the secular Hellenism of its day.

In a sense, the prayer of Al-ha-Nissim is more than an expression of gratitude. It is an indication of our recognition of the Divine role in human history. It is an expression of our consciousness of the "mighty hand and the outstretched arm" of God which was revealed first in the exodus from Egypt and which is continuously revealed to the sensitive religionist in every critical period of our people's history.

No one who stood at the Red Sea could fail to see the role of God in that drama. The Talmud tells us that even a simple hand-maiden as the Sea was able to see God's influence in the world in a way in which even the most sensitive prophet could not envision it. In a sense, however, the simple hand-maiden can only see God's influence when it is clear and direct, while the prophet is able to perceive Divine Providence in every blade of grass and in every heart that beats.

One of the fundamental messages of Chanukah is that human history is not an accident, that the standard interpretations of cause and effect in the life of our world is not the whole story. The Maccabbean struggle could be viewed in that way but it is not.

Historians can show that a variety of historical forces combined to produce the stunning victory of the Maccabbees over the Greeks. There was the heroism of Judah and his family, the internal intrigues within the Greek Empire, the untimely— or timely death of Antiochus Epiphanes. Much the same kind of historical analysis could be applied to the story of Purim. There also, the events that led to the triumph of Mordecai and the fall of Haman from his tyrannical power, could be explained in terms of cause and effect. So, too, the modern miracle of the establishment of the State of Israel and the triumph of its tiny army over seven Arab invading nations could be ex-

"Blessed are Thou O Lord Our God King of the Universe who has performed miracles for our forefathers in days of old at this time." As He has performed miracles in the past, so may we find favor in his eyes that he may shield us from the winds of circumstance and the storms of human existence.

#### The Women's Bible Class

The Women's Bible class, which meets every Monday morning at 11:00 o'clock, is in the middle of its second month of sessions. At present there are 43 women who are registered in the course and who attend the classes regularly.

The class this year is studying the second book of the Bible, Exodus. Rabbi Haskel Lookstein's lectures on the Book will be concerned with eight general subjects during the course of the year. The titles of these subjects as included in the syllabus of the course are as follows: "A Family Becomes a People"; "Moses and His Mission"; The Redemption of a People"; The Bible As Law"; "Divine Revelation"; "How Civil Is Jewish Civil Law"; "The Golden Calf"; and "The Sanctuary".
