

### PURIM NOTES TO PARENTS

This Wednesday evening we will usher in the holiday of Purim with the traditional Purim service, highlighted by the reading of the Megillah. This service is of exceptional interest to the children of our congregational family and we have made special arrangements in order to ensure that they will be comfortable and happy.

All children will receive the appropriate noisemakers with which to react demonstratively to the mention of the name of Haman. Special sections in the synagogue will be reserved for them.

Parents are requested to conform to the following arrangements for their children:

1. All children will meet in the auditorium of the Synagogue House at 5:30. They will receive their groggers and the instructions for their use. Ramaz teachers and several members of our Teenage Group will be on hand to supervise the children.

2. From the auditorium, the children will be brought to their special sections in the Main Synagogue. Parents are requested to leave the children to the supervision of those who are in charge. The children will be much better off this way and their elders will be able to enjoy the service that much more.

The Purim schedule can be summarized as follows:

5:20—Mincha Service in the Chapel5:30—All children assemble in the auditorium

**6:30**—Ma'ariv and the reading of the Megillah in the Main Synagogue.



# A PURIM MESSAGE "DON'T READ IT BACKWARDS"

Among the many rules which pertain to the reading of Megillat Esther is the requirement that it be read in the order in which it is written. Jewish Law tells us that we may not read the Megillah backwards, that is, we may not read a later chapter and follow it with an earlier chapter.

A great Chasidic rabbi once explained this law in figurative terms. He told his disciples that one may not read the Megillah "backwards", that is: one may not read it as if it were merely history. When one considers the events described in the Megillah and when one contemplates the Hand of God in the rescue of His People, one may not read it as history.

To read the Scroll of Esther as history is to misread it on two counts. First, we tend to think of history as the natural unfolding of events in the process known as "cause and effect." In other words, every event in history was brought about by a previous cause. The event in question itself may then be a cause of a future event.

This mechanistic view of human history omits the possibility of Divine intervention in the historical arena. To be sure, one may read the Scroll of Esther as a natural unfolding of historical events. As a matter of fact, the name of God is omitted entirely from the Megillah, thus giving support to the historical view. Our understanding of the Megillah, however, is that the unseen Hand of God can be sensed in the unfolding of the drama. The Megillah is testimony to God's revelation in the historical affairs of Shushan long ago.

Misreading the Megillah as history, involves another error. The incident which the Megillah describes is but an archetype of many moments in time in which Divine Providence plays an unseen role. The victory of the Maccabees and the rededication of the Temple in 165 B.C.E. was such a moment. The establishment of the State of Israel in our day and the victory of its armies over seven invading Arab Nations is a similar moment. To consider the events of the Megillah as a one time occurrence is to misconstrue the message of the Megillah for our day and for every generation.

From its literal interpretation and from its figurative explanation, we can thus see that "he who reads the Megillah 'backwards' has not fulfilled his obligation."

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## PURIM DAY Schedule and Notes

On Thursday morning, February 27th, a special Purim morning service will be held in the Synagogue Chapel at 7:00 o'clock. The highlight of this service is the reading of the Megillah by our Ritual Director, Israel D. Rosenberg. Without the traditional noisemakers, the Megillah is appreciated for what it is a moving and thrilling story of danger and rescue and a stimulus to the praise of God.

The entire service will be concluded by 8:30 to enable all to attend to their daily affairs. A special invitation to this service is extended to those children who are off from school on Purim Day. In point of fact, the original obligation for reading the Megillah was in the morning rather than at night. The nighttime reading, which has become so popular in our day, was a secondary addition.

# Mrs. Al ha-Nissim

In the three services of Purim, as well as in the Grace After Meals, the prayer of Al ha-Nissim is added as an expression of thanksgiving to God for the miracle which he wrought to our forefathers at this season of the year. It is interesting to note that on Purim we do not recite Hallel—The Psalms of Praise—because the reading of the Megillah itself is considered to be praise to God.

#### **Exchanging Gifts**

A traditional practice on Purim, which is recorded in the Megillah, is the exchange of culinary gifts between friends. This practice is matched by the requirement to give charity to the poor as well.

#### The Festive Repast

In the late afternoon on Purim Day it is customary to have a Purim Seudah —a festive repast with all the holiday trimmings. The meal lasts until after dark and should be conducted in the merry spirit of the Festival.

May this year's Purim usher in an extended period of peace and happiness for all mankind.

### Morning Minyan Inaugurated
