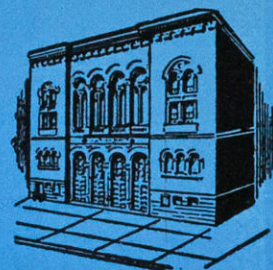

SISTERHOOD PLANS NOVEL PROGRAM FOR APRIL 6th

The forthcoming meeting of the Kehilath Jeshurun Sisterhood on Monday, April 6th promises to be one of the most exciting and stimulating experiences for the Sisterhood in recent years. On that date the Sisterhood will feature a special program entitled "Self Testing Your Prejudices". The program is designed to bring to the surface, latent prejudices which we possess but of which we are frequently unaware.

The program will follow a Dessert Luncheon served at 12:30 o'clock. It will be conducted by several women of our Young Marrieds Group.

Such a program has been conducted by the Anti-Defamation League of the B'nai B'rith for several women's groups in the Metropolitan area. The reactions have been most enthusiastic. In a most subtle manner the group prejudices are brought out and then analyzed by a specialist. The results are not only informative and illuminating but, also, corrective in character.

A cordial invitation is extended all members and friends of the Sisterhood to participate in what promises to be a most interesting afternoon.

ADULT INSTITUTE SEASON COMES TO AUSPICIOUS CLOSE

Enthusiastic Gathering Participates In "Siyum" Celebration

The 1963-64 season of the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute is now officially over. It will go down in the annals of our congregation as the most productive season of Adult Education in our history. Close to 150 members and friends gathered last Wednesday evening to celebrate the conclusion of this memorable season.

During the coming weeks, we will have occasion to publish in the Bulletin the amazing facts and figures of this past season. Suffice it to say, at present, that during the last five months more students than ever before enrolled in more courses than ever before; more students will receive credit from the Yeshiva University Department of Adult Education than ever before; the quality of the courses and the treatment of the subject matter was, also, on a much higher level than in the past.

At the closing exercises, one could sense the feeling of accomplishment among the student body and the guests who joined in the celebration. The student body began to arrive for the regular 8:00 classes; it was aug-

mented by many who came specially for the final lecture of Dr. Irving Agus; it was augmented still more by those who came for the "Siyum".

"Siyum" Celebration

The "Siyum" marked the completion of a Tractate of the Talmud by our weekly Talmud class. During the past five years the class engaged in the study of "Beitzah", a Book of the Talmud dealing primarily with Festival Laws. Rabbi Haskel Lookstein spoke briefly in explaining one passage of this Tractate. The passage dealt with the primacy of the study of Torah in Judaism. This is expressed by the Talmud in saying that no matter how much a person expends in this study he will be more than compensated for it by God.

More than 200 men and women expended effort and interest in our Adult Institute this year. In addition to the rewards of satisfaction and accomplishment they will no doubt be blessed by God for their personal dedication to the study of Torah.

EIGHT YOUNG MEN TO CHANT "SONG OF SONGS"

On Saturday morning, April 4th, the last day of Passover, eight young men of the Congregation will chant the "Song of Songs" as part of the regular services. It has become a practice in our Congregation during the past several years that the young men of the Congregation chant this beautiful Book of the Bible.

The "Song of Songs" was authored by King Solomon in his youth and is especially suited to the mood of the season and to the charm of these young men.

They were trained by our Ritual Director, Israel D. Rosenberg. You may be confident, therefore, that their reading will conform to the high standards which we have come to expect

from the young men who read at our services.

The reading of the "Song of Songs" will begin at about 10:00. We urge our congregants to be in the Synagogue at that time. In so doing, they will give the young men, who are reading the "Song of Songs", the encouragement and recognition which they deserve.

Disposal of Chametz

No chametz may be eaten on Friday, March 27th after 9:45 A.M. All chametz must be completely disposed of by 10:45 A.M.

Sale of Chametz

The ritual sale of chametz must be completed by Friday morning, March 27th. Those who have not performed this sale as yet are urged to attend to the matter by seeing the Rabbis or the Ritual Director. They will be on hand early Friday morning for this purpose.

Service for First Born

Passover Eve is a traditional fast for first born. It is obligatory upon every first born who cannot observe the fast on Friday, March 27th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate at its conclusion in the light collation that is served. The service for the first born (Siyum Bechorim) will be held in the Chapel on Friday as part of the regular morning service. It will begin at 7:30.

We urge all first born to make a special effort to be with us on Friday morning.
