

Forty Eight to be Graduated from Ramaz High School Thursday, June 11th

One of the finest Senior Classes in the history of Ramaz High School will be graduated from the school next Thursday night, June 11th. The class, comprising 48 students, is remarkable for several reasons.

First and foremost of these reasons is the excellent class spirit which prevails among the seniors. The young men and women of this class work extremely well together, they have an excellent record of school leadership and they have advanced the fortunes of Ramaz in every area of interscholastic activity.

This class supplied four of the five starting members of this year' premier championship basketball team of Ramaz. The class has fostered the publications and activities of the inter-Yeshiva Council and supplied leadership for its programs. The class numbers among its members five junior members of the congregation; Lanny Binstock, Harriet Garfinkel, Vivian Pik, and Stuart Podell.

Regents Scholarship Record

Continuing in the tradition of previous graduating classes, the current honor class has established for itself an enviable record in the competition for New York State Regent Scholarships. Of the 46 students eligible to take the test – one student is from New Jersey while another is an Israeli citizen – 34 have already won regent scholarships while one has won a Nursing award. The percentage of winners, we have reason to believe, is the highest for the State.

In addition to the Regent Scholarships, members of the class have been cited for academic excellence in many other types of competition. Three students were finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Competition; three students are candidates for Scholarships from the National Honor Society; one received a citation from the Mayor's Committee on Scholastic Achievement; two received medals from the American Mathematical Association; one student received the Betty Crocker Homemaker Award; one of the students received the Bausch and Lomb Science Medal. The same student was a finalist in the Westinghouse Science Talent competition.

College Placement

As might be expected, this class has established an enviable record in winning admission to colleges all over the country. Many of the students were admitted to the city colleges of New York. In addition, the following are some of the colleges which have accepted our students:

THE WEEKLY PORTION SHELACH

"The Grasshopper Complex"

In this week's portion we read how the Children of Israel sent spies to tour the Promised Land before attempting to enter and conquer it. The spies returned with mixed feelings about the Land.

On the one hand, they saw this Land as one flowing with milk and honey. They brought back samples of the delicious fruit of its trees and soil. On the other hand, they reported that the Children of Israel could not possibly conquer the Land. The inhabitants were giants and the fortifications were too powerful.

One phrase which they used is most revealing. "We were in our own eyes as grasshoppers; and so were we in their eyes." This is known as the grasshopper complex. It means that if a person views himself as inadequate, then he actually renders himself inadequate thereby. Morever, if a person considers himself inferior it is most likely that others will see him as he sees himself.

There is something seemingly indigenous to the Galut personality which breeds this type of complex. It was not only characteristic of the generation of the wilderness. It was rampant through much of the 2,000 years of exile. This weakness, insecurity and existential fright was bemoaned by medieval philosophers and modern poets alike.

The triumphant visit of the Prime Minister of Israel, Levi Eshkol, this week, highlights the spiritual transformation through which the Jewish people has passed during the last hundred years. The optimism of the "Lovers of Zion", the confidence of the early Chalutzim, the self respect of the Modern Israeli are all symbols of this transformation — a process which has affected the posture of world Jewry as well.

The arrival of Mr. Eshkol calls to mind the impassioned statement of Caleb and Joshua in this week's portion: "We shall surely ascend to the land and settle in it, for we are fully equal to the task."

These were the words of giants and not of grasshoppers. Such giants alone can lead the way to a blessed life in a Promised Land. PARK EAST RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

An interesting parallel was drawn between the words of the Negro Freedom song: "I believe that we shall overcome" and the words of the Ani Ma'amin which was chanted by our brethren during the persecutions in Europe.

Rabbi Simon Langer, spiritual leader of our neighboring Congregation Orach Chaim which, together with our congregation and Zichron Ephraim, sponsors the Park East Religious School, delivered the charge to the two graduates, Elaine and Susan Schwartz. He also awarded them their diplomas. Rabbi Langer spoke of the occasion as a true commencement exercise - not an end but a beginning. We are most happy to learn that the Schwartz sisters are planning to attend the Manhattan Hebrew High School in the fall and thereby continue their Jewish education

A Woman of Valor

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein then rose to speak a few words of tribute about Mrs. Alice Rothkowitz, a devoted teacher in the Park East Religious School who has served in this capacity for 20 years. During that time she educated a generation of children in the technical aspects of Hebrew and in the spirit of Jewish tradition.

Mrs. Rothkowitz was described as a true woman of valor, whose "children rise up and praise her saying that many daughters have done well but thou excellest them all." Like the woman of valor described in the final chapter in the Book of Proverbs, the value of Mrs. Rothkowitz to our school and to the children whom she has taught over the past 20 years cannot be truly estimated.

Mrs. Rothkowitz is the teacher of the primary grades. She is the one who introduces the Hebrew language to the children of the school. She opens

Mrs. Rothkowitz also serves as the teacher of the Advanced Hebrew Class in the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute. She has served in that capacity for some 8 years now and she has a group of students who have made splendid progress in reading and writing modern Hebrew. Although our adult education season formally ends at the end of March, the practice for Mrs. Rothkowitz is to continue her class through April and May on a voluntary basis.

The Park East Religious School presented its veteran teacher with a special scroll of honor and with a set of the Soncino Bible in honor of this occasion. The school considers itself fortunate to have a woman of her caliber and with her exceptional dedication serving our community in the field of Jewish education.

We reprint the full text of President Johnson's welcoming speech to the Prime Minister of the State of Israel, Levi Eshkol.

"Mr. Prime Minister, ladies and gentlemen: I am very happy, Mr. Prime Minister, to welcome you to our country. Your predecessors have visited my country informally several times in the past, but this is the first official visit by a Prime Minister of Israel. We are pleased that you have come. My countrymen greatly admire the progress made by your people. You have met and mastered monumental problems of economic survival. You have shown all the world how to use science and technology to improve man's life on the planet.

"Today, Israel is a vital, prosperous land, a symbol of the courage and the strength of her people. The United States is proud to have assisted in this high enterprise. We are prepared to continue our contributions to technical advancement in Israel, particularly in the field of desalination of water. We are aware, Mr. Prime Minister, of the problems of political adjustment that Israel faces with her neighbors. We know that you want to live in peace with those neighbors, and we believe it not only possible but imperative that those problems be peacefully resolved, bringing justice to all as well as security for all.

"We welcome this opportunity to exchange views with you on matters of mutual interest. We share many common objectives, Mr. Prime Minister, chief of which is the building of a better world, a world in which every nation can develop its resources and develop them in freedom and peace. I am confident this visit will result in increased understanding between us and a strengthening of our already cordial relations."
