#### NOTES ON PURIM SERVICES

1. Purim will be ushered in on Saturday evening in the synagogue. Mincha will begin at 5:40 P.M. It will be followed by a short talk on the laws and significance of Purim.

2. Ma'ariv will begin at 6:40 in the main synagogue and will be followed by the reading of the Megillah.

3. The Sunday service will start promptly at 9:15 A.M. The reading of the Megillah will take place at 10:00 o'clock. Uniform prayerbooks and Taleisim will be provided for all. The men, however, are urged to bring their own Tephilin.

4. Students of the Park East Religious School will meet at 9:00 o'clock in the third floor lunchroom from where they will be brought to the synagogue. Ramaz children and all other youngsters will assemble in the synagogue chapel at 8:45. They will be escorted to the synagogue from there.

5. All children will receive noise-makers at their places of assembly. Please be sure, therefore, to bring your children to the proper place at the right time so that the necessary arrangements may be made for them.

6. All worshippers are invited to be the guests of the Sisterhood and Men's Club at a light snack which will be served in the social hall following the service. The snack for the children will be served in the third floor lunch room.

#### A PURIM MESSAGE "DON'T READ IT BACKWARDS"

Among the many rules which pertain to the reading of Megillath Esther is the requirement that it be read in the order in which it is written. Jewish Law tells us that we may not read the Megillah backwards, that is, we may not read a later chapter and follow it with an earlier chapter.

A great Chasidic rabbi once explained this law in figurative terms. He told his disciples that one may not read the Megillah "backwards," that is: one may not read it as if it were merely history. When one considers the events described in the Megillah and when one contemplates the Hand of God in the rescue of His People, one may not read it as history.

To read the Scroll of Esther as history is to misread it on two counts. First, we tend to think of history as the natural unfolding of events in the process known as "cause and effect." In other words, every event in history was brought about by a previous cause. The event in question itself may then be a cause of a future event.

This mechanistic view of human history omits the possibility of Divine intervention in the historical arena. To be sure, one may read the Scroll of Esther as a natural unfolding of historical events. As a matter of fact, the name of God is omitted entirely from the Megillah, thus giving support to the historical view. Our understanding of the Megillah, however, is that the unseen Hand of God can be sensed in the unfolding of the drama. The Megillah is testimony to God's revelation in the historical affairs of Shushan long ago.

Misreading the Megillah as history, involves another error. The incident which the Megillah describes is but an archetype of many moments in time in which Divine Providence plays an unseen role. The victory of the Maccabees and the rededication of the Temple in 165 B.C.E. was such a moment. The establishment of the State of Israel in our day and the victory of its armies over seven invading Arab Nations is a similar moment. To consider the events of the Megillah as a one time occurrence is to misconstrue the message of the Megillah for our day and for every generation.

From its literal interpretation and from its figurative explanation, we can thus see that "he who reads the Megillah 'backwards' has not fulfilled his obligation."

#### YOUNG MARRIEDS HOLD A FASCINATING MEETING

The evening which promised to be the best of the season turned out to be even better than expected. This was the unanimous reaction of the forty or so Young Marrieds who gathered in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Irwin Shapiro for the meeting of the Young Marrieds Group last Saturday

The program for the evening called for a panel symposium on "The Artificial Control of Life," featuring a doctor, a lawyer and a rabbi - and chaired by a periodontist. Unfortunately, the rabbi's control of his health was not sufficiently precise to allow him to participate, but, gratifyingly, the chairman filled in much of the information in the religious area which was to have been presented.

Dr. Moses Nussbaum presented some of the medical facts and concerns with respect to birth control, artificial insemination and abortion. Some of his revelations were most startling, particularly the one which estimated that probably the number of illegal abortions in the United States, during the past year, has exceeded one million.

Martin Rochlin presented a historical and contemporary survey of the posture of the law toward each of the three fields. He, too, was able to demonstrate many startling facts, some of which indicated the intolerable conservatism of the law in keeping pace with medicine, and others which indicated the healthy restraining effect of law on abuses in the artificial control of life.

Dr. Charles I. Cohen, as chairman, introduced the entire subject, moderated the lengthy question period, and indicated some of the guidelines of Jewish law which operate in these three areas. Above all, he cautioned that these matters are of the utmost concern to Jewish law, and that many rabbinic responsa have been written in answer to questions in these fields.

It is important, therefore, that while certain guidelines might be discussed, any question involving a particular case ought to be referred to rabbinic authority. After all, these matters are hardly less significant that the accidental mixing of dishes, which frequently occasions a question to a rabbi.

The entire discussion lasted over two hours and made available a great deal of important information on some of the most vital problems facing moral man today.
