PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

One of the most beautiful and meaningful ceremonies associated with Passover is Bedikat Chametz — the search for chametz. The ceremony is composed of three parts:

1. The reciting of a special blessing over the mitzvah of the removal of chametz.
2. The search of the house by the light of a candle to find vestiges of chametz.
3. The reciting of the formula of nullification whereby the searcher renounces possession over any chametz that he may not have seen and of which he is not aware.

The fact that this ceremony will be observed this year on a Sunday night, April 3rd, gives us a splendid opportunity to experience the full impact of this religious observance.

Children, especially, will be impressed by the ceremony if it is performed with enthusiasm and dedication and not merely "gone through" formally and perfunctorily.

The children, of course, ought to place the pieces of chametz in the various rooms — a practice which ensures that the search will not be in vain.

The children can hold the candle and the feather; they can and should examine their own possessions, dressers and desks, for long forgotten relics of chametz.

Passover is not only a beautiful festival. It is a serious one too. Both the beauty and the seriousness can be captured twenty-four hours in advance by a careful observance of Bedikat Chametz.

Some Truths and Fallacies**

**AM haSEFER GROUP
DISCUSSES SINGER BOOK**

A fascinating discussion of Isaac Bashevis Singer's memorable book, "The Magician of Lublin," was held last Wednesday evening in the home of Dr. and Mrs. Theodore R. Fink. The discussant was Mrs. Mordie Mann, the wife of the Chairman of our Adult Institute Committee, and an instructor of the senior class in English at the High School of the Yeshiva of Flatbush.

Mrs. Mann described the background of the author as well as some of his general ideas concerning Judaism, religion and creativity. She then proceeded to analyze the many insights of the book into the character of the protagonist in particular and into the general problem of good and evil and the quest for self knowledge.

Through Mrs. Mann's many faceted interpretation of the themes of the book, it became clear why Singer has achieved great popularity on the American literary scene, especially among college youth. The book is basically an account of the alienation of the protagonist from life in general, from society, and from tradition and roots. The unfolding of the story describes the attempt of the hero to restore himself to life in general and to these phases of it in particular. The book also treats characters from a psychiatric point of view without in any way becoming technical. The problem of evil in man, and man's quest to control that evil, also a significant one for our day, is similarly probed.

Finally, the book has appeal for our generation because it describes the existential crisis of a human being, a crisis which finally leads to his return to ultimate roots and to a fuller relationship with God.

**PRICES FOR CEMETERY PLOTS
TO BE INCREASED**

Beginning with June 15th coming, cemetery plots on the Beth-El grounds of the congregation will be increased by about 20%. This decision was announced by the Board of Trustees of the congregation.

For some time plots on that cemetery were obtainable at prices far below those in effect at other cemeteries. The congregation, nevertheless, was anxious to make these plots available to our congregational family at most reasonable prices.

Up to now eight-grave plots could be purchased at \$1,200.00, \$1,400.00 and \$1,600.00, depending upon location. On June 15th these plots will cost \$1,400.00, \$1,600.00 and \$1,800.00, respectively.

We know that many members have been considering the purchase of family plots. We are anxious to assist them and we, therefore, urge them to take advantage of the current rates before the increases go into effect.

The Synagogue office will provide all information and assistance to those who are interested.
