DEDICATION CEREMONIES HELD FOR NEW BUILDING

600 ATTEND HISTORIC OCCASION IN LIFE OF KEHILATH JESHURUN

A once in a lifetime moment was experienced by some 600 members of Kehilath Jeshurun and parents of Ramaz School who filled the entire main floor of the synagogue on Sunday, May 22nd. The occasion was the historic Dedication of the new Synagogue House and Ramaz School building.

From the opening chant of Cantor A. Joseph Cohen until the conclusion of the festive collation which followed the ceremonies, this was a day to remember and a moment in the annals of our congregation which will go down in history.

The ceremonies began with an impressive processional of the rabbis and the trustees of the congregation and Ramaz. They were accompanied by Cantor A. Joseph Cohen and the Oscar Julius Choir.

Highlights of the proceedings were: the opening prayer by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, drawn from King Solomon's immortal words on the occasion of the dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem; greetings by Max J. Etra, President of the Congregation, and A. Phillip Goldsmith, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Ramaz; responsive scriptural readings by the rabbi and the congregation; and a beautiful cantorial selection by Cantor Cohen.

Gratitude and Prayer

The most moving moments were provided by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein in his brief address. The rabbi spoke of our gratitude not only to those who by their material support made this dream a reality but to generations gone by who made the dream itself possible. He cited the heroic efforts of the founders of Kehilath Jeshurun and the builders of the material and spiritual legacy upon which we were able to build.

He expressed the prayer that we would fulfill their hopes and bring to fruition today and tomorrow the aspirations of these noble spirits.

Following the rabbi's words, Mr. Etra explained the nature of the testimonials to the most generous contributors to the building project. Plaques will be unveiled in their honor in the various rooms of the building. Temporary facsimiles of these plaques can be seen now on the front wall of the synagogue.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Following Rabbi Haskel Lookstein's benediction, the assemblage recessed to the area in front of the new building where the ribbon cutting ceremony was held. The symbolic opening of the new building by the cutting of the ribbon was performed by two men who have been most responsible for the physical construction of this beautiful house of study: Elgin Shulsky, the indefatigable chairman of the Building Committee and Samuel Singer his devoted and experienced co-chairman.

The gathering then proceeded to the new ballroom where a celebrational collation was held, catered by Arnold Caterers. The atmosphere was like that at a family "simcha." And so it was; a happy, blessed and memorable moment for all of us who shared in a glorious dream and helped to bring it to glorious fulfillment.
