Subscription To New Edition Of Talmud Available

English Translation and Commentaries Included

We are pleased to announce that a new edition of the Talmud is available through our congregation. The nature of this edition makes it one of the most exciting prospects in Jewish education in many many years.

The details are as follows: The EL-AM Company in Israel is producing a new edition of the Talmud in pamphlet form, beginning with the first Tractate, Berachot. The edition includes the original Aramaic text, voweled and punctuated; an excellent English translation; and commentaries which explain the text according to classical and modern interpretations.

The publication method is as follows: Each month a pamphlet is published which incorporates about two or three pages of the Talmud with all of the features described above. During the course of a year, ten such pamphlets are made available. The cost to the general public is \$15.00 a year. Through the congregation, subscriptions may be entered at \$12.00 per year.

We strongly recommend that every household subscribe to this excellent publication. It is possible to study the Talmud from this publication without any outside help.

The Talmud program of the Adult Education Institute of our congregation will be geared to the study of the material presented in this first year of publication. We will try to arrange group study sessions to fit the needs of various segments in the congregation.
