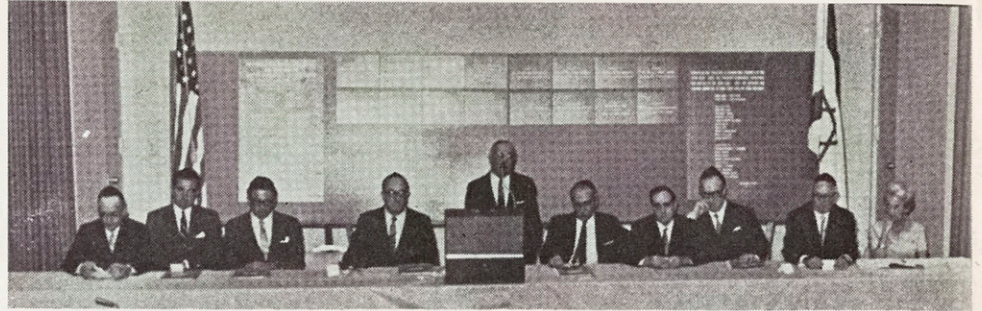
ANNUAL MEETING (Continued from Page 1)

During the past several years we have done much in our congregation to make the observance of Tisha B'Av increasingly meaningful to the modern American Jewish worshipper. This year we will introduce a new feature which will make the service particularly intelligible. Through the generosity of the Men's Club, we have purchased a new prayer book for Tisha B'Av which will be used at our evening and morning services.

The prayer book, published in England, is an attractive volume which features not only an excellent translation of the Book of Lamentations and the traditional dirges for Tisha B'Av but which also contains excellent explanatory notes, which all will find useful.
