TISHA B'AV-1966

We cannot allow an occasion like this last Tisha b'Av to pass without some comment on the nature of the services and the mood and feeling of our worshippers.

On Monday evening, July 25th, the chapel of the Congregation was filled with 150 worshippers for the inauguration of this meaningful day on the Jewish calendar. The services, conducted by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and Cantor Cohen, helped to create a mood of mourning and reflection appropriate to Tisha b'Av.

We were particularly fortunate to have available a new volume for Tisha b'Av with an excellent English translation and abundant notes on the prayers and readings. As a result of this new book, made available to the Congregation through the generosity of the Men's Club, we were able to introduce the reading of additional dirges and prayers which enhanced the spirit of the day.

The morning services on Tuesday was also beautifully attended. The participation of the worshippers in the special readings was moving and inspiring.

According to a Chassidic tradition, the Tisha b'Av books are disposed of each year in the confidence that, by the time next year rolls around, the redemption will have come and Tisha b'Av will have been rendered an anachronism. We join fervently in that hope, but in the event that Tisha b'Av is still observed next year, we hope that it will be as inspiring and as meaningful as it was this year.

JEWRY DUTY PARTICIPANTS INCREASE DURING PAST YEAR

For twelve years now, Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun has sponsored a program known as "Jewry Duty." During that time, more and more members of the congregation have joined the ranks of those who support the daily Minyan by their personal participation.

During the past year, more than 125 members of our congregational family obligated themselves to attend at least one full week of morning services. This is the highest figure in the history of this program. We are proud of the awareness on the part of our membership of the importance of the institution of daily worship.

We are happy to say that as a result of the dedication of our "Jewrors," the daily Minyan continues to function on a sound basis. In addition, many members of the congregation have been introduced to the practice of regular daily worship, as a result of their participation in the Jewry Duty program.

It is gratifying to learn that Orthodox synagogues throughout the country have taken our model program and have introduced it into their religious services with similar success. The Kehilath Jeshurun Jewrors, therefore, are performing a service for themselves, for the congregation, and for the wider traditional Jewish community in this land.

We hope that next year those who have not as yet taken the opportunity to become part of Jewry Duty will feel it a personal obligation to join us in the support of this vital program.

A REQUEST TO MEMBERS

With the experience of the past few years, we know that before the High Holy Days the congregation will be deluged with numerous requests by new residents who seek to worship with us during the High Holy Days. We would be happy to accommodate all. Unfortunately, however, we have no ladies' seats available and only a limited number of men's seats.

We appeal to our members, therefore, to assist us if they can. Some members may be away from the city during the High Holy Days. We urge them to inform us accordingly, so that we may be able to accommodate others in their places.

Naturally, a member of the congregation has priority over all others and is always welcome. If, however, one is in a position to be helpful to a new resident, he is performing not alone an act of courtesy, but one of religious generosity.

THE MONTH OF ELUL

On Wednesday, August 17th, the month of Elul will be ushered in. This is the month of Penitence which serves as a prelude to the High Holy Day season.

The experience of Teshuvah — repentence — is described by the medieval Jewish philosopher, Bachya ibn Paquda, as the restoration of the proper relationship between man and God, a relationship which has been disturbed by man's shortcomings and improper behavior.

This will explain why the four letters of the Hebrew word Elul are considered as abbreviations for the verse from the Song of Songs: Ani l'Dodi v'Dodi Li — I belong to my beloved and my beloved to me (A reference to the bond of affection between God and Israel).

During this month we try to set our spiritual house in order. We reconsider our behavior and revise it where necessary. We fulfill all outstanding moral obligations. We examine our ritual symbols — like Tephillin — for adjustment or replacement. In general, we use this month for a spiritual stock taking and a religious inventory for ourselves and for the society of which we are a part.

The success of our efforts during Elul will determine the success of the High Holy Day experience. More important than that, however, it will determine our success as human beings during the year to come. Therefore, let us heed the words of the Prophet and the comment of the Talmud. "Return O Israel to the Lord your God;" on which the Talmud comments, "How great an experience is repentence for it brings man to the throne of God."
