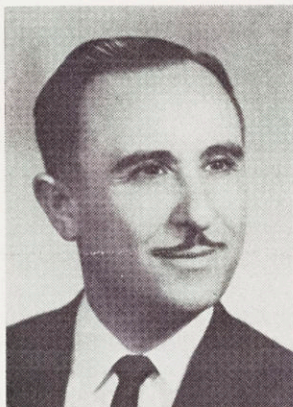




**"CAMPUS YOUTH — A CHALLENGE" TO BE DISCUSSED AT

## THE WEEKLY PORTION

## Mishpatim

**"People Who Were in Glass Houses"**

"You shall not wrong a stranger; neither shall you oppress him, for you were strangers in the Land of Egypt." This statement from our weekly portion is, according to the Talmud's count, one of 36 — some say 46 — Biblical injunctions against maltreating a stranger. Why this repetition?

A stranger is defined by Rashi as anyone who moves into your neighborhood from a different one. A stranger need not be foreign, nor particularly different; he is defined simply as a new resident.

An obvious reason for warning against mistreating a stranger is because of the latter's inexperience with the community. He is "green" and hence he constitutes easy prey for the charlatan. Like the widow and the orphan he needs special protection from the unscrupulous.

But our sages note a more subtle reason. They assert that the Jews, having been strangers in Egypt, should sympathize with the lot of the new-comer and understand his insecurity rather than take advantage of it. Moreover, if we persecute the stranger for his strangeness, for his poor background, or for the fact that he is a burden upon the community, the stranger has a right to retort that we ourselves were once strangers like him. In other words; people who were in glass houses shouldn't throw stones even after they have emerged from them.

The nativist movement in America in the 1840's and 50's ignored this principle. German Protestants, only one generation removed from immigrant status themselves, vented their fury on the Irish Catholics who came to these shores. Many German Jews in the last decades of the 19th century tried to discourage Jewish immigration from Eastern Europe by a variety of unbecoming means.

This is a normal reaction of the former immigrant. Is it due to the fear of competition for the employment which the settler has won by hard work? Is it a subconscious revulsion when confronted by the spectre of what he once was? Whatever the reason, it is an unjustifiable response. A stranger is entitled to the same chance as the established settler. He is not to be persecuted by those who at one time or another were strangers themselves.

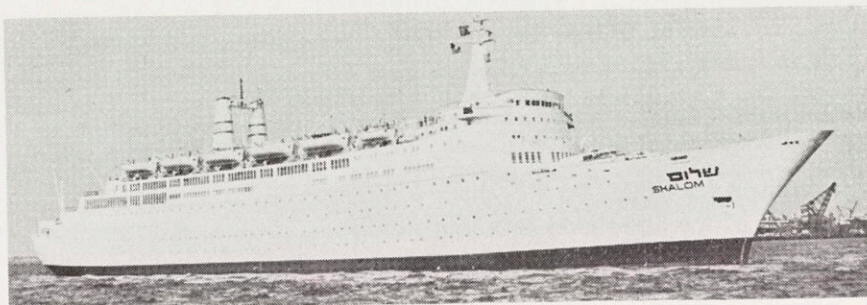
