## Cub Scouts Help "Pack" Father and Son Minyan



#### Terumah

#### "On Being Soft and Hard"

According to our portion for this week, the Ark in which the Tablets which Moses received from Sinai were kept was to be made from acacia wood. Several commentators wonder why wood was chosen as the building material for that Ark.

One of these commentators relates this building material to the following remark of our sages: "A man should always try to be as soft as a reed and not as hard as a cedar." He ponders the fact that, despite this comment, softness is not always a virtue, nor is hardness always a negative trait.

One ought to be soft in his daily affairs. In our day, we tend to disparage a person who in his business life behaves like a "softy." In actuality, one ought to be soft in business, not to the point of being weak in decision making but at least remaining soft to the extent that he considers the feelings of others.

Surely, in one's interpersonal relations — another type of "dealing" — a man and a woman ought to be soft, understanding, compassionate, flexible, bending, much like a reed rather than like a cedar.

On the other hand, when it comes to upholding the Torah, man ought to be as firm, as straight and as unwavering as a tall cedar of Lebanon. The winds of circumstance and the currents of contemporary thought ought not to shake him from his roots or divorce him from the rich tradition through which he gathers strength, nourishment and continuity.

Like the cedar, he ought not to be afraid to stand out among his peers. When he is asked: "Why can't you bend with the times," he should be able to stand firm and say: "My tradition is not altered by the times; on the contrary, it is Jewish tradition which itself alters the times, the prevailing view, the false idols, the mistaken doctrines."

To symbolize the unwavering stance of the Traditional Jew in upholding the Torah, the Ark in which the Tablets of the Law were housed was made of wood, a strong material, a "living" material, and an enduring material.
