AM hasefer GROUP DISCUSSES "CHILDREN OF THE KIBBUTZ"

Next Meeting to be held March 14th

The next meeting of the Am haSefer Group will be held on Tuesday evening, March 14th, at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Theodore R. Fink, 110 East End Avenue. The discussion will center around A. J. Heschel's, "Man Is Not Alone." Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will lead the discussion.

The most recent meeting of the Am haSefer Group featured a discussion of "Children of the Kibbutz," by Melford E. Spiro. The discussion was led by Dr. Norman V. Balinson.

Dr. Balinson described the book as an objective, well-written, scientific study of how children are reared in a kibbutz setting. On the basis of the book it would appear that the upbringing to which the children are exposed is rather well-equipped to prepare them for communal living. It is this goal which, of course, presents a problem to Americans who read the book with a certain bias against socialized living. In order to appreciate the book and what it describes, it is necessary to try to diminish our natural bias against the theory described.

During the presentation by Dr. Balinson and the discussion that followed, it was apparent that there are legitimate criticisms which might be leveled against the book. Certainly one is that the author does not try to describe the general method of kibbutz child rearing. He focuses on one particular kibbutz which is not at all representative.

Especially lacking is a treatment of how child rearing is achieved on a religious kibbutz. In that kind of setting there are many differences which would be worth noting.

God's Sabbath - Not Man's

The subject of the Sabbath is introduced in this week's portion by the words: "But you shall observe my Sabbaths." The commentary, Alshich, offers a penetrating explanation of this strange expression.

Moses, the Midrash tells us, originally requested a day of rest for the Jewish people in Egypt. He successfully persuaded Pharaoh that the slaves would produce better if they were given the Sabbath day for rest each week.

When God tells Moses to instruct the Jewish people concerning the command of the Sabbath, He is careful to tell him that the Sabbath is more than a day of physical rest. "But you shall observe My Sabbaths." You shall keep the Sabbath as I have ordained it and as I, as it were observed the Sabbath following the creation of the world.

I "do not tire and am not fatigued" (Isaiah, 40). My Sabbath is primarily a day of spiritual meaning and only secondarily of physical rest. On my Sabbath your primary obligation is to refrain from creative activity. You must understand the Sabbath in My terms and not as a servant of your needs.

This is particularly relevant to the pragmatic and rationalistic temperament of our day. There are many who define the Sabbath in their own terms, not in terms of God's will. Some of us see the Sabbath purely as an opportunity to engage in special activities, ranging from basketball in the park to a leisurely drive in the country. The justification for this by well-meaning youngsters and adults is that these are not weekday activities.

They are not Sabbath activities either. They are fine on Sunday; but it is precisely because they are engaged in on Sunday that Sunday has no Sabbath spirit. A Shabbat experience is realized only when a family strives to observe the Sabbath as God ordained it and not as man might have designed it had he been its architect.

If the Sabbath spirit has eluded us in part or in full, let us try to find it through God's injunction to Moses: "But you shall observe My Sabbaths." We will find that God's Sabbath readily becomes ours too.
