"Making a Difference"

In concluding the description of the dietary laws in this week's portion, the Torah speaks of the importance of distinguishing between the fit and unfit, the permissible and the forbidden in foods.

This is but one of the many places in Bible and commentaries where the principle of Havdalah — distinguishing finely and precisely between two situations — is discussed. God — and man too — distinguishes between night and day, holy and profane, Israel and the nations.

All societies know of such fine distinctions. Lawyers will argue the fine points of a contract down to the placing of a comma. Judges will distinguish between "separate but equal" and "equality" as a constitutional requirement for education. In every matter of law, fine distinctions — as opposed to blurry ones — must be made.

Judaism, however, extends this principle to the whole of life because the whole of life is governed by Jewish law. Thus the Talmud opens with an extensive debate on when precisely does day pass into night, for on the decision rests the time for reciting the evening Shema.

A kosher home is one in which a careful housewife makes fine distinctions between milk and meat, between salted and unsalted poultry, between a reliable kosher butcher and one who merely puts a sign in his window.

The Sabbath rests upon the ability to distinguish precisely between the profane week and the holy seventh day, distinctions made in time, activity and preoccupation.

There are no policemen or judges present to enforce such distinctions. The conscience and intelligence of the Jew is the only enforcement agency. This may be why the Havdalah blessing is placed on Saturday night in the blessing concerning intelligence and undertanding (Ata Chonen). For it is upon such intelligence that the principle of Havdalah rests.

It might be added that herein too lies the difference between Israel and the nations. The nations practice the act of Havdalah only in certain formal legal matters. The Jew is called upon to distinguish precisely in every area of life between right and wrong, pure and tarnished, holy and profane. This is the major uniqueness of the Jew and Judaism. All the others are in a sense, ramifications of it.




