THE WEEKLY PORTION TAZRIA

"Are Skin Blemishes Skin Deep?"

Our portion for this week, as well as the one for next week, is concerned mainly with physical skin disorders which may affect the individual during his life. This includes skin sores,

boils and leprosy.
While these physical blemishes are observed as eruptions of the skin, the Torah and the Talmud view them as being merely external manifestations of a non-physical ailment. This is clearly indicated by the rule that only a priest may treat such blemishes. "The verse ordains that the diagnosis and treatment of sores and boils are the

task of the priest" (Rashi). The underlying spiritual cause for this type of illness is, Lashon Hara (gossip), according to our sages. Gossip is not to be construed here in its narrow sense of tale bearing alone, but rather in its broader connotation, referring to a deep seated antagonism on the part of the individual toward his fellow man which leads him to speak ill of others. The aggression which torments such a man's soul is not expressed outwardly toward his family and neighbors in hostile acts,

of the skin. The priest is the ancient healer who diagnoses and treats this ailment of the spirit. It is the priest who is described as: "A lover and pursuer of peace and a lover of man." It is the priest who can attempt to restore harmony within the soul of the emotionally afflicted by rendering him at peace with his fellow man.

PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

Thirty days before the festival, one is supposed to begin reviewing the laws of Passover and preparing for the holiday. In that spirit we include below a number of items for your attention in preparation for Passover.

The most important factor about Passover is the prohibition of eating chametz during the Holiday. Chametz is defined as one of the five principal varieties of grain which has come in contact with water and been allowed to ferment. Typical examples of chametz are, of course, breads, wheat cereals, alcohol and other substances which have grain in them.

In addition, on Passover we are not permitted to eat even the most minute quantity of chametz. Consequently, we avoid using any processed food whatsoever which does not have reliable rabbinical endorsement as being kosher for Passover.

In this connection, a word of caution is advisable. Not every "kosher for Passover" seal can be accepted as reliable. The fact that a store has a Passover section does not mean that we can rely upon the appropriateness for Passover use of every item sold in that section. It is best to rely on the products of the reputable matzoh firms, or on products which bear the special Passover seal of approval of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregation.

In the event that our readers have questions about a particular product endorsed by an individual rabbi, an inquiry to the synagogue office will assure them of reliable information.

Sale of Chametz

In addition to not eating chametz on Passover, Jewish law forbids us to have any chametz in our possession. Whatever we cannot dispose of before the holiday may be sold in accordance with Jewish law. Such sale, however, requires authorization. Those who wish to do so may see our rabbis personally to authorize them to sell their chametz. Those who cannot do so may use the form below, which will serve the same purpose.
