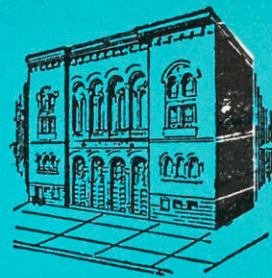

PASSOVER WORKSHOP FOR WOMEN MONDAY, APRIL 17th

On Monday morning, April 17th, in the social hall of the synagogue, the Kehilath Jeshurun Sisterhood will sponsor a workshop on the subject: "Preparing for Passover."

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will explain some of the practical considerations in preparing the home for Passover. He will also discuss some of the important themes in the Haggadah and make recommendations for observances and customs which will enliven the Seder in the home.

As a special added feature, a number of women will prepare descriptions of their favorite — and delectable — recipes for Passover dishes. As a matter of fact, those of our women readers who would like to make others aware of their own favorite recipes are invited to write them down and send them to the synagogue office. We will mimeograph them for the use of the women at the workshop.

An opportunity will be given to all present to ask questions and to clarify any matters pertaining to the Passover festival. A cordial invitation is extended to all women to attend on Monday morning, April 17th, from 10:30 to 12:00 o'clock.

"THE PHILOSOPHY OF PURPOSE"

IMPLICATIONS FROM THE FIRST COMMANDMENT IN THE TORAH.

TAZRIA

"Are Skin Blemishes Skin Deep?"

Our portion for this week, as well as the one for next week, is concerned mainly with physical skin disorders which may affect the individual during his life. This includes skin sores, boils and leprosy.

While these physical blemishes are observed as eruptions of the skin, the Torah and the Talmud view them as being merely external manifestations of a non-physical ailment. This is clearly indicated by the rule that only a priest may treat such blemishes. "The verse ordains that the diagnosis and treatment of sores and boils are the task of the priest" (Rashi).

The underlying spiritual cause for this type of illness is, Lashon Hara (gossip), according to our sages. Gossip is not to be construed here in its narrow sense of tale bearing alone, but rather in its broader connotation, referring to a deep seated antagonism on the part of the individual toward his fellow man which leads him to speak ill of others. The aggression which torments such a man's soul is not expressed outwardly toward his family and neighbors in hostile acts, but rather finds its outlet in eruptions of the skin.

The priest is the ancient healer who diagnoses and treats this ailment of the spirit. It is the priest who is described as: "A lover and pursuer of peace and a lover of man." It is the priest who can attempt to restore harmony within the soul of the emotionally afflicted by rendering him at peace with his fellow man.

Recent medical studies have produced considerable evidence which indicates that many types of skin disorders are more than skin deep and are rooted in the soul. The modern "Doctor of the Soul" is a scientific oriented edition of the ancient priest whose function was to establish harmony between man and man, accord between man and God and peace between man and himself. PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

Thirty days before the festival, one is supposed to begin reviewing the laws of Passover and preparing for the holiday. In that spirit we include below a number of items for your attention in preparation for Passover.

The most important factor about Passover is the prohibition of eating chametz during the Holiday. Chametz is defined as one of the five principal varieties of grain which has come in contact with water and been allowed to ferment. Typical examples of chametz are, of course, breads, wheat cereals, alcohol and other substances which have grain in them.

In addition, on Passover we are not permitted to eat even the most minute quantity of chametz. Consequently, we avoid using any processed food whatsoever which does not have reliable rabbinical endorsement as being kosher for Passover.

In this connection, a word of caution is advisable. Not every "kosher for Passover" seal can be accepted as reliable. The fact that a store has a Passover section does not mean that we can rely upon the appropriateness for Passover use of every item sold in that section. It is best to rely on the products of the reputable matzoh firms, or on products which bear the special Passover seal of approval of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregation.

In the event that our readers have questions about a particular product endorsed by an individual rabbi, an inquiry to the synagogue office will assure them of reliable information.

Sale of Chametz

In addition to not eating chametz on Passover, Jewish law forbids us to have any chametz in our possession. Whatever we cannot dispose of before the holiday may be sold in accordance with Jewish law. Such sale, however, requires authorization. Those who wish to do so may see our rabbis personally to authorize them to sell their chametz. Those who cannot do so may use the form below, which will serve the same purpose.
