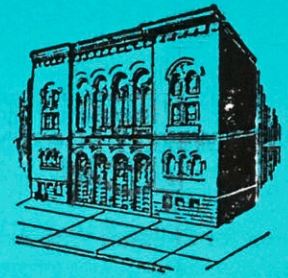

The Closing Meeting of the season of the Kehilath Jeshurun Men's Club was held on Sunday morning, May 21st. The meeting was preceded by a morning service and a community breakfast. A fine group of men turned out for the combined religious, social and organizational function, which concluded a very successful season.

Following the Presidential Report on the activities of the year, Mr. Ira F. Weisman, Chairman of the Nominations Committee presented the fol-

lowing slate of officers for the forthcoming year: Abraham R. Kirshon, President; Martin R. Rochlin, Vice President; Milton Eletz, Treasurer and Dr. Charles I. Cohen, Secretary. The slate was elected by acclamation.

Additional Grants

The members voted to increase their grants to Ramaz School and to the Park East Religious School. Abraham R. Kirshon pointed out that this was made possible by the support given to the Men's Club through its fund raising endeavor, the Theatre Party.

He thanked all those who made it possible to carry out a full philanthropic program of assistance to the schools mentioned above, to the Yeshiva University Torah Leadership Seminar and to the Boy Scout Troop #613 and for the Father and Son Minyan.

Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein concluded the meeting with an inspirational message concerning the work of the Men's Club and the ever-increasing role which younger people are playing in the development of the Club.

This project, together with the Theater Party under the chairmanship of Mrs. Hollander, was responsible largely for the extensive and generous contributions which the Sisterhood made to a variety of causes during the past year.

Generous subsidies were given to Ramaz and the Park East Religious School. Camps Massad and Morasha were the beneficiaries of scholarships. The Sabbath kiddush was provided every week throughout the year. The sukkah was decorated and a new Memorial Tablet was purchased for

the congregation. Truly, a remarkable record.

One of the highlights of the meeting was the induction of new members into the Sisterhood. New members were officially welcomed into the membership by Mrs. Joseph H. Lookstein, Membership Chairman. Those new members who were present were introduced and presented with appropriate corsages.

A Lesson for Children Who Are Parents

Our Portion this week, which concludes the Book of Leviticus, is notable particularly for its clear treatment of the subject of reward and punishment. Explicit in this week's Portion is the idea that as a man behaves in this world so shall he be treated by it.

An excellent example of this pattern is provided by the child-parent relationship. It is the accepted rule in Judaism that the child must have reverence — not only love — for his parents at every stage in life. This is true even in the likely circumstance these days that a child surpasses his parents in education and insight.

We live during a period of a knowledge explosion. By the time one has been out of college for ten years his education is likely to be obsolete and almost archaic in terms of the developments since his graduation. How then shall the highly educated young man or woman relate to his parents who, by comparison, are almost untutored? Shall he still revere them and accept their judgements because of their position? Shall he continue to do so even in another ten years, when he will have not only knowledge but also more experience?

Judaism's answer would seem to be that a child must always revere his parents although parents should not take undue advantage of that obligation. The reason is that parents are the vehicles for the transmitting of a tradition, a way of life and a system of thought. If the child ceases to revere his parents it is to be expected that his children will not revere him. In such a case, the entire system upon which a tradition rests totters and falls.

All of this is predicated upon the conclusion that the way a man acts so will he be treated. An irreverent son or daughter will himself rear irreverent sons and daughters. And on the contrary, the respectful child will engender respect in his children.

Examples abound which will prove this thesis. None is more poignant than the commentary of our Sages on Jacob as a son and a father. They tell us that Jacob, who failed to communicate with his father throughout his tenure in Laban's household, suffered a similar fate when his son Joseph failed to communicate with him throughout his servitude in Egypt.

As a man behaves, so shall he be treated.
