HE WHO MOURNS THE DESTRUCTION OF JERUSALEM WILL YET REJOICE IN ITS RESURRECTION (Ta'anit, 30b)

Never in history have these words from the Talmud conveyed more meaning than for our generation and our day.

Our generation has witnessed the re-establishment of the State of Israel after almost 2,000 years of Jewish statelessness. The tears and mourning of countless generations of our people kept alive a hope and faith that some day redemption would come.

Nineteen years ago the dream came true, but it came true only in part. A state was born, but its boundaries were slim; its security was tenuous; and its neighbors had pledged that the tenure of the state would be short-lived.

From June 5th through June 10th of this year all of this was changed. Through the miraculous victory of the armed forces of Israel, the security of the land has been enhanced, the borders have been extended and the threats of Israel's neighbors have been reduced to words; words which have not even proven effective in the United Nations with the powerful diplomatic support of the Soviet Union.

We, in America, who lived in the proverbial "sac cloth and ashes" during the three weeks of crisis, have seen our mourning turn to joy. Our empathetic fright for Israel's fate has been transformed into a vicarious thrill and pride in her glorious resistance to belligerency and in her triumph over her adversaries.

V'Al ha-Kol, and above and beyond all this, we have witnessed the return of Jerusalem to the dominion of Israel. Jerusalem, the site of our ill-fated Temple, the locus of i's one remaining wall, the place toward which every Jewish heart turns in prayer: Jerusalem is ours! We who have mourned its destruction can now rejoice in the prospect of its reconstruction.

The future, with God's help, can be bright indeed. But there is yet much for which to mourn and pray. More than seven hundred Israeli lives were lost. Countless others were wounded. The city still lies in ruins, its holy places decimated, its Temple only a dream in our eyes.

On the Sabbath before Tisha B'Av – Shabbat Chazon – we will recite special prayers reflecting this dual mood of mourning and gratitude. On Tisha B'Av eve and day we will commemorate the historical misfortunes of Israel and pray for an end to tragedy and grief.

Join us on Shabbat Chazon and on Tisha B'Av, and may we who mourn the destruction of Jerusalem be privileged to participate in its full reconstruction and in the blessed era of mankind's redemption.

TISHA B'AV SERVICES

During the past several years, the observance of Tisha B'Av at Kehilath Jeshurun has become a more meaningful experience. The congregation has introduced a new Prayer Book, purchased through the generosity of the Men's Club, which makes the service more intelligible to worshippers.

The Prayer Book is an attractive volume which features an excellent translation of the Book of Lamentations and the traditional dirges for Tisha B'Av. It contains excellent explanatory notes, which worshippers will find useful and enlightening.

Tisha B'Av this year occurs on Monday evening, August 14th and Tuesday, August 15th. It is a solemn day in our religious calendar and reminds us of the age-old woes which have befallen our people.

In Israel on Tisha B'Av, thousands of young and old will flock to the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem, to worship at the foot of what was once the Holy Temple.

We urge members and their friends to join us on that solemn day for the observance of this day of mourning.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON AND STATE SENATORS HEAR FROM KEHILATH JESHURUN

Close to 600 Telegrams Sent Thus Far

An immediate and heart-warming response was received for the appeal to our members for the authorization to send individual telegrams in their names to President Johnson and Senators Javits and Kennedy.

Thus far, some 200 members have responded and sent in their checks for \$3.54 to cover the cost of the three telegrams. We have already dispatched the telegrams for each members who has responded.

The substance of each telegram was similar, although the phraseology varied. In each case, gratitude was expressed for the discreet, though firm, support for Israel and we asked for the continuation of that policy and for the support of Israel's guardianship of Jerusalem as a city open to all.

You Can Still Respond

Those who have not as yet responded may still do so by sending a check to the synagoue office for \$3.54 to cover the cost of the telegrams. We will take care of the rest.

The need remains urgent. Please, therefore, do not delay and do not wait for your neighbor to act. The responsibility is incumbent upon each and every one of us.
