LUBAVITCHER APPROACH TO ORTHODOX JUDAISM TO BE DISCUSSED AT LECTURE WEDNESDAY, JAN. 31

The third installment in our Adult Institute lecture series, "Directions in Orthodox Judaism on the American Scene," will be forthcoming on Wednesday evening, January 31st, at 9:00 o'clock. On that occasion we will hear a lecture on "The Lubavitcher Approach" by an outstanding representative of the Lubavitcher Movement in this country.

Our guest speaker will be Rabbi Zalman I. Posner, a young and dynamic graduate of the Lubavitcher Yeshiva in Brooklyn. Rabbi Posner has been the spiritual leader of Congregation Shearith Israel in Nashville, Tennessee for the past eighteen years. He is also chief chaplain of all military installation in middle Tennessee.

Our guest speaker has written widely in a variety of popular and scholarly journals on the theme of Chassidism. He is also the translator of four major works on the Lubavitcher Movement and Approach.

He will describe the program of a group which has energetically engaged contemporary secular forces in spiritual combat. The movement has struck bold roots in the soil of American life, especially in areas where Jewish communities are small and are isolated.

A cordial invitation is extended to all to attend what promises to be a stimulating and informative evening. The lecture will be followed by a question and answer period and the evening will come to a conclusion with a light collation.

"The First Angry Men"

"Simeon and Levi are brothers, their swords are weapons of lawlessness. Let not my person enter their councils nor my spirit be joined to their company. For they slew men in anger . . . Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce and their wrath, for it is relentless . . ."

These are the words used by Jacob on his death bed with which to castigate two of his sons who displayed unbecoming anger in response to the episode with Shechem.

Anger is considered by the Talmud to be an extremely reprehensible characteristic in man. It is a manifestation of the supremacy of the "Yetzer Hara", to such an extent that the angry man is likened to one who worships idols. The psalmist referred to this quality when he said, "There shall not be within you a foreign god."

Anger is often an emotional response to an alleged deficiency in others, which mirrors a genuine deficiency in ourselves. We tend to be most disturbed when we see others doing that of which we ourselves are guilty and hence ashamed.

Korach, a descendent of Levi, was thus afflicted by the sickness of selfrighteous anger. He wanted to be a ruler. Consequently, he bitterly accused Moses and Aaron of pre-empting leadership for themselves. He saw in them a disease which they did not possess, but which he did.

Zimri, a descendent of the Tribe of Simeon, was similarly stricken. Wanting to indulge his immoral lust for a Midianite woman, he accused Moses of having sinned by taking a Midianite wife.

A similar self righteous anger is evident in our own day and in our own community, in the form of an organization called "Operation Yorkville." Its purpose is to rid this community — and the entire country — of the plague of salacious literature.

There is no doubt that such literature constitutes something of a threat to the health of our society. But anyone who has seen this organization's films and read its bulletins, cannot help but wonder at the intense tone, the overbearing anger, the unbridled hatred and the venomous attacks on Justices in the State Courts and in the U. S. Supreme Court.

One fears that this angry organization is composed of many guiltridden people who see the salacious even when it does not exist and who

exaggerate an unfortunate condition beyond all logical proportions.

One never sees his anger as a manifestation of his own guilt. He cloaks it under the mantle of pure and holy pursuits. Simeon and Levi posed a problem to Jacob because they contended that their act was not vengeance, but rather just retribution. The facts, however, proved otherwise. Justice may have warranted the execution of Shechem and his son, but certainly not the murder of an entire male population. Furthermore, these same brothers were also partners in the plan to murder Joseph.

The lesson for us is clear. Anger is an extremely insidious and dangerous device. It is generally used self-righteously with the excuse of "Kiddush ha-Shem." In most instances, however, it is a sick response, motivated by base and vindictive motives and a selfdeluding self-righteousness. In short, it is usually a "Chilul ha-Shem."
