THE WEEKLY PORTION SHEMOT

"An Insight from the Past for a Contemporary Problem"

"And it came to pass, after many days, that the King of Egypt died; and the children of Israel groaned from beneath their slavery and they cried out." (Exodus 2:25)

The sainted Reb Yitzchak Mayer of Ger — the founder of the Gerer Chassidic dynasty — pondered the question why the slaves first groaned and cried out after "many days." We find no mention of their rebellious feelings prior to this moment, although the oppression had been increased measurably, many times before.

His answer is quite relevant for our day. "In the beginning, the Israelites were so mired in "galut" that they did not even feel it. Now, however, when the first sparks of redemption began to appear, they first began to feel and comprehend the extent of their "galut" and they commenced to groan."

Such a process has repeated itself many times during the course of world history. Up to a certain point, the slave, the serf, the peasant, the laborer is so restrained and submerged in bondage that he does not begin to fathom the evil of the system of which he is a part. He is not aware of the extent of his own degradation.

It is only when a few minimal reforms are achieved that the light begins to dawn upon the oppressed. Then, and only then, does the real revolution take place. Then, and only then, do the exploited and persecuted become revolted by their new-found self-awareness.

This insight into the reaction of our people in Egypt, long ago, ought to make us empathize more with the underdeveloped and unfulfilled nations of our world, and with the deprived and underprivileged portion of our populace in this country today. Thirty years ago they caused very little trouble. But then, thirty years ago they were so mired in their "galut" state as to be unaware of their own degradation.

Today, many things have happened to create the first sparks of opportunity and dignity for them. Their newly articulated groans and cries are the inevitable result of these first glimmerings of redemption. It is our task not to stifle those groans and cries, but rather to hasten the time when freedom, dignity and opportunity will be the first portion of all mankind.

Reunion with Families from Russia

Positive steps may NOW be taken to further the reunion of Soviet Jewish families with their relatives in the United States and other countries.

While false hopes must not be raised, a significant number of Jews continue to leave the Soviet Union. United Hias Service, the worldwide Jewish migration agency, through its professional services, is prepared to advise on the specialized procedures to facilitate reunion of families.

Jews in this country must take the initiative in extending an invitation to their relatives in the Soviet Union to join them. Unless such an invitation is extended, their relatives cannot request exit documents from the Soviet Government.

In many instances American Jews may have lost contact with their relatives in the USSR. United Hias Service is in a position to assist families in locating their relatives in the Soviet Union.


OUR TRAVELLERS
