Resolving a Theological Dilemma

THE WEEKLY PORTION VA'ERA

"Faith and Willingness"

When Moses brings the news of God's intention to liberate the Jewish People from Egyptian servitude, the reaction of the Children of Israel is most surprising. "And they would not listen to Moses because of shortness of spirit and hard service."

The Midrash offers an interesting interpretation of this reaction. The "shortness of spirit" was simply a lack of faith in the possibility of emerging from their miserable status, while the "hard service" was a reference to the slaves' unwillingness to abandon the service of idols. Although the Jewish People cried out from their misery, they refused to accept the message of hope and they were unwilling to relinquish a practice which was a contributing factor to their misery.

This Midrashic insight is applicable to a wide range of human problems, both personal and universal. There are ever so many people who suffer from personal problems and who, in their depression, manifest a lack of faith in their ability to surmount their problems and a lack of willingness to take the necessary steps to change the course of their lives.

On a universal level there are many clear examples of this syndrome in action. It wasn't too long ago when people laughed at the possibility of the United States and the U.S.S.R. reaching an accord for limiting nuclear explosions in the atmosphere and controlling the proliferation of nuclear armaments. Just about eight years ago the first goal was achieved, while only this past week we have seen agreement on a draft treaty for the control of proliferation of nuclear weapons presented to the Geneva Disarmament Conference jointly by the United States and the U.S.S.R.

It has been possible to achieve even this initial success only because of the faith of the leaders of the two governments involved, as well as their willingness to change the atmosphere that has generally prevailed, an atmosphere of belligerency, rather than of

There are those among us who speak eloquently about the redemption of this world from the bondage of prejudice, hatred and short-sightedness. Let us not be guilty of deafness to the pleas of the enlightened leaders of our time "because of shortness of spirit and hard service."

HEADLINES OF JEWISH INTEREST

Jewish Priorities Disputed

We feel you would be interested in a report published in the current issue of the Journal of Jewish Communal Service, which describes a survey conducted in a California Jewish community of priorities in Jewish Communal Services.

The study, made by a Professor at San Francisco State College, showed rather conclusively that religious leaders — both lay and rabbinic — differ sharply from communal leaders who determine the distribution of funds from united community appeals. The difference between the two groups is clearly evident in what they consider to be the priorities of Jewish life.

In a list of eight different areas to which funds have been contributed, the religious leaders ranked the Jewish Education Bureau first, while the welfare fund leaders ranked it fourth. The Jewish Day School was ranked second by the religious leaders, while the welfare fund leaders placed it in last position.

The Jewish Center was ranked fourth by the religious leaders and second by the fund. The Jewish sponsored hospital, ranked seventh by the religious leaders, was put in first place by the fund.

It is not surprising, therefore, that there is a good deal of ferment going on in religious circles - including orthodox, conservative and reformed concerning the outmoded and "ruttish" practices of federations and welfare funds. The fact that one hundred years ago a Jewish hospital may have been the first order of business, does not necessarily mean that it must be the first order of business today. Inasmuch as the welfare fund derives its income from all religious groups in the community, it would seem to be only a matter of time before the leaders of religious groups make clear to the welfare fund where they feel Jewish communal monies can be put to the best advantage and service for the community.
