"IF I FORGET THEE, O JERUSALEM"

Far from being forgotten, Jerusalem was uppermost in our minds last week-end as Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun celebrated the anniversary of the liberation and reunification of Jerusalem at three separate occasions during the course of the week-end.

An unusually large congregation assembled on Saturday morning and heard an address by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, in which he lamented the fact that new religious forms and rituals have yet to be developed which would capture the exalted moments of modern Jewish history.

Our Associate Rabbi indicated that the climactic events of the past few years have been paralleled in Jewish history only during the period of the Exodus from Egypt. It is necessary, he said, to find ways of making this totally new era in our historic existence religiously meaningful and spiritually alive

At the conclusion of the service, Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein called upon the entire congregation to rise for the singing of Hatikvah. Many tears were shed by the worshippers as they reflected upon the difference in their mood this year and last year at this time.

On Saturday evening, another large turnout assembled for Mincha and Ma'ariv and for the halakhic analysis of the requirement to recite Hallel on Sunday, Iyar 28. Rabbi Haskel Lookstein analyzed and developed the halakhic opinion of Chief Rabbi Unterman on this subject.

The highlight of the entire weekend, however, was reached on Sunday morning when the congregation's chapel was packed with over 100 worshippers, including men, women and children, who gathered for the special service in commemoration of Jeru-

His talk was followed by a spirited and, at times, explosive question and answer period, during which many of the women had a chance to express themselves on issues concerning which they felt strongly. The entire discussion, however, produced much more light than heat and left everyone just a little bit wiser concerning an issue that seems to be growing increasingly complex and disturbing.

A HOLIDAY MESSAGE "The Festival Without a Symbol"

Shavuoth is the one holiday of the year without any visible symbols or unique observance. There is no Shavuoth symbol like the Sukkoth sukkah or the Passover matzoh. There is no observance which is a counterpart to fasting on Yom Kippur or sounding the Shofar of Rosh Ha-

In a sense, there is no need for a special symbol or observance. Shavuoth is in itself special. It is the paramount holiday because it represents the giving of the Torah, the single historical act which gives the Jewish People its character.

"If not for that day," says Rabbi Yossi in the Talmud, "there would be many Yossis in the marketplace." If not for the giving of the Torah, there would be no Judaism and no Jewish People, no Land of Israel and no history of Israel.

Our rejoicing on Shavuoth is for our privilege to be what we are, to live by the standards of the Torah and to imitate the ways of God. In a sense, the symbol of Shavuoth is with us through the year and the unique observance of the festival is our pattern of behavior throughout life. Shavuoth serves mainly as a periodic reminder.

SHAVUOTH IN OUR SYNAGOGUE

The festival of Shavuoth will be observed this year on Sunday and Monday, June 2nd and 3rd. It will be an inspiring occasion at Kehilath Jeshurun.

In keeping with the special traditions of this holiday, the synagogue will be gaily decorated with green foliage. The final benediction of the year will be pronounced by the Kohanim at the regular services.

Special features, first day

The first day of the holiday is marked by the reading of that part of the Torah which contains the Ten Commandments. Prior to the reading, Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will chant the traditional Akdamuth prayer.

Special features, second day

On Monday, the Book of Ruth will be chanted by four young men of our congregational family. They are:

TIKKUN LEIL SHAVUOTH

This year, again, we will conduct Tikkun Leil Shavuoth on the first evening of the Shavuoth festival. This program was begun several years ago and attracts more people each year.

The custom of Tikkun is an ancient one. In days gone by, men would gather to read selections from the Books of the Torah and the Talmud in order to symbolize the importance of Jewish learning on the holiday which commemorates the giving of the Law. The session would last until early in the morning and, after reciting the morning prayers, the assembled would return home to sleep.

Our practice is a somewhat modified one. We begin our program at 10:30 p.m. and we conclude at midnight. We invite not only men but

women too; not only the old but also the young.

At this year's Tikkun program, Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will lead the group in the study of the laws relating to Tephillin. For the last few weeks, a group has met regularly and has studied the laws and significance of Tephillin as contained in the Code of Jewish Law. It is fitting that on Shavuoth night the study session should be devoted to the portion that the group has been studying.

A special invitation is extended to all to come on Saturday night; June 1st, at 10:30 o'clock, to participate in Tikkun Leil Shavuoth. Refreshments will be served as part of the evening's fare.


